Kent Municipal Council.

JULY SESSION 1892.

19th July, 1892.

The warden calls Council to order at 2 p. m.

All present except Councillors F. M. Richard and Bourgeois. Minutes of last meeting read and approved.

Councillors Daigle, Barribeau, Johnson, Peters, Murphy, Wathen, C. I. LeBlanc, Gesner, Bernard and Poirier appointed Finance committee.

Councillor Murphy presents petition of Isabella Wheten, praying for correction of her assessment. Referred to the Finance committee.

Thomas Frecker appointed constable to attend this session at \$1.00 per day.

Councillor Peters presents petition of Charles Hannay, praying for correction of his assessment. Referred to the Finance committee.

Council adjourned until 10 a. m. to-morrow and Finance committee goes into session.

WEDNESDAY, 20th July, 1892, 10 a. m.

Council called to order at 10 a. m.

All present except Councillors F. M. Richard and Bourgeois.

Minutes of last meeting read and approved.

Councillor Murphy submits report of Public Wharf committee stating sale of Public Wharf this year to Allan Hains for \$50.25, being 25cts. more than upset price—the only bid received at auction. Report accepted.

Moved by Councillor Johnson, seconded by Councillor Wathen and resolved that the Council advise the Wharf committee how to act concerning the amount payable by the lessee of the Public Wharf.

Moved by Councillor Gesner, seconded by Councillor Peters and resolved that the Wharf committee be empowered to accept the proceeds of the Public Wharf for 1892 from Mr. Haines, in full payment of his notes for lease, if they deem it in the county's interests to do so.

Councillor C. I. LeBlanc gives notice of motion for to-morrow at 10 a. m. to divide District No. 1, Wellington, into two districts.

Councillor F. M. Richard excused from attendance at this session, on account of sickness.

Councillor Bourgeois excused from attendance at this session.

Council adjourned until 2 p. m. to-day.

WEDNESDAY, 20th July, 1892, 2 p. m.

Council called to order at 2 p. m.

All present except Councillors F. M. Richard and Bourgeois.

Councillor Wathen presents petition of George H. Morton, for the payment by the municipality of costs of appeal in his prosecution against one McPherson for abusive language.

Stipendiary Bailey heard in support of the petition.

The clerk of the peace being asked whether the county should pay this bill or not, says he is not aware of the exact nature of the case, but the county is responsible for all costs incurred in prosecuting crime of all kinds.

Moved by Councillor Gesner, seconded by Councillor Wathen, that the costs of appeal—not to exceed \$15.00—be paid by the county.

Question. Yeas:—Councillors Wathen, Gesner, Curran, Murphy—4. Nays:—S. D. LeBlanc, Bernard, Barribeau, Poirier, C. I. LeBlanc, Johnson, Peters, J. F. Richard, Leger, Daigle, Betts—11. Motion lost.

County Treasurer Forbes hands in debenture No. 5, dated 2nd July, 1883, \$500 @ 6 per cent interest, which he has redeemed. Ordered, that the debenture be destroyed.

Councillor Gesner gives notice that at 10 a. m. to-morrow he will move that St. Mary be divided into highway districts.

Councillor Peters presents petition of Edward Hannay praying for correction of his assessment. Referred to finance committee.

The county treasurer states that there has been no payment made to him this year on account of licenses issued.

J. & W. Brait's letter, objecting to the way in which their assessment in Richibucto was made this year, referred to the finance committee.

Moved by Councillor Murphy, seconded by Councillor Bernard, and resolved, that the inspector of licenses be notified to attend this board at 10 a. m. to-morrow.

Council adjourned until 10 a. m. to-morrow.

THURSDAY, 21st July, 1892, 10 a. m.

Council called to order at 10 a. m.

All present except Councillor F. M. Richard.

Minutes of last meeting read and approved.

Moved by Councillor Gesner, seconded by Councillor Leger, and resolved, that the Parish of St. Mary be divided into highway districts as follows:—No. 1, all that part of the parish on the north side of Buctouche River; No. 2, all south of the river and east of the northwest road, except those residing along said road; No. 3, all the remainder of the parish on the west of said road.

Ordered, that Coroners Doherty and D'Olloqui be paid \$20 each for summoning jury panels in Planagan vs. Wheten.

Ordered, that THE REVIEW printing bill, \$102, be paid.

The inspector of licenses states that he will pay in the license money collected, that George Johnson did not take the license granted to him, but that Hugh Dysart has received a license.

Council adjourned until 4 p. m. to-day.

THURSDAY, 21st July, 1892, 4 p. m.

Council called to order at 4 p. m.

All present except Councillors F. M. Richard and Leger.

Clement Casey's petition for payment for support of a pauper, presented by Councillor Murphy.

Mr. Richardson and the petitioner heard in explanation of the petition.

Moved by Councillor C. I. LeBlanc, seconded by Councillor G. Richard, and resolved, that the prayer of the petition be not complied with, and the petitioner's bill be not paid.

Councillor Johnson submits that the bills of St. Louis assessors for extra work on valuation be paid.

Council adjourned until 10 a. m. to-morrow.

FRIDAY, 22nd July, 1892, 10 a. m.

Council called to order at 10 a. m.

All present except Councillors F. M. Richard and Leger.

Minutes of last meeting read and approved.

Ordered, that Coroner d'Olloqui's bill, \$20.00, for summoning jury in Livingstone vs. Rusk be paid.

Councillor Gesner presents petition of Philip Woods for hotel license. Resolved said petition be considered at 4 p. m. to-day.

Councillor Peters gives notice that a motion to the provincial government asking for the removal of the license inspector from office will be submitted to the council this afternoon, and desires notice to that effect served on the inspector, or left at his residence.

Moved by Councillor Peters, seconded by Councillor C. I. LeBlanc, and resolved, that all justices collecting delinquent rates make full and complete returns to the next January session.

Ordered, that Bernard LeBlanc be paid \$9.00 in full of his bill for attending a fever patient, under instructions from the Board of Health.

Council adjourned until 2 p. m. to-day.

FRIDAY, 22nd July, 1892, 2 p. m.

Council called to order at 2 p. m.

All present except Councillors F. M. Richard, Leger and Daigle.

Moved by Councillor Peters, seconded by Councillor Bernard, and resolved:—Whereas, by resolution adopted by this board in January last, it was resolved that John T. Caie, Esq., inspector of licenses, of the County of Kent, should pay into the hands of the county treasurer all sums of money received by him, under the act of assembly, according to the requirements of said act, and whereas, from an inspection and examination of the books of the county treasurer, it is evident the said inspector has not paid over any portion of the moneys received for licenses granted last January session for any purpose whatever, this being the fact, we consider the said inspector has acted in entire violation of his duty, in withholding funds belonging to the county, and which should have been appropriated as the law directs. We therefore recommend that the provincial government be requested to cancel his appointment as such inspector for the county of Kent, and not defeat the purposes of the act, nor sacrifice the interests of the ratepayers of the county, by permitting Mr. Caie to remain in office, who has forfeited the confidence of the municipal council, which, we believe, truly represents the best interests of the people, and fully resolved that the secretary forthwith convey a copy of this resolution to the attorney general for the action of the government.

Ordered, that Vital R. Richard be paid \$10.00 in full of his bill for services rendered to the sick in St. Louis under instructions from the board of health.

Moved by Councillor Johnson, seconded by Councillor Pineau, and resolved, that no further action be taken on Philip Wood's petition for license.

Resolved, council adjourn until 4 p. m. to-day.

FRIDAY, 22nd July, 1892, 4 p. m.

Council called to order at 4 p. m.

All present except Councillors F. M. Richard, Leger and Daigle.

Councillor Gesner submits report of finance committee, recommending payment of bills to amount of \$147.30

Ordered, that all bills recommended by the finance committee for payment be paid

Resolved, that the secretary provide a copy of the minutes of this session to THE REVIEW on condition such minutes be printed gratuitously.

Minutes of this days meetings read and approved.

A vote of thanks having been tendered the warden for the efficient manner in which he presided over the deliberations of this session. Resolved, that the council adjourn sine die.

The wholesale trade of the country have a distributing machinery which handles the "Myrtle Navy" without any addition to its permanent expenses. If the manufacturers were to undertake that work, as they would by selling to the retail trade, it would require an independent machinery, the whole cost of which would have to be borne by the proceeds of the tobacco sales, and of course it would fall upon the consumer. Selling to the wholesale trade alone is, therefore, for the consumer's benefit, and is a convenience to the retail trade, because every traveller who calls in the grocery line—can take orders for "Myrtle Navy."

It is reported in a Glasgow paper that an engineer of the city has, after nineteen years of experimenting, devised an arrangement whereby the steam issuing from an engine is returned to the boiler after doing its work in the cylinder. In stationary engines the invention works wonderfully. A test in one cloth factory shows that one ton of coal does the work of seven tons under the old plan. If all that is said of this device is true, it ranks among the greatest discoveries of modern times. It results in a greater saving of fuel than that produced by having the air that passes into the reduction furnace heated by the flames that escape from it. This invention will be likely to reduce cost of manufacturing many articles at least one-third.

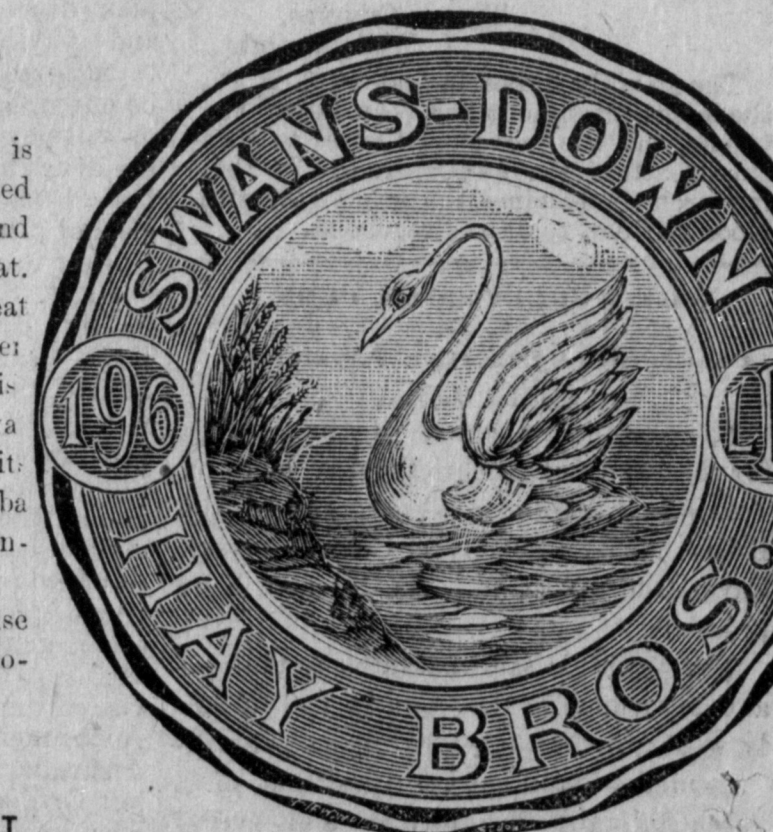
