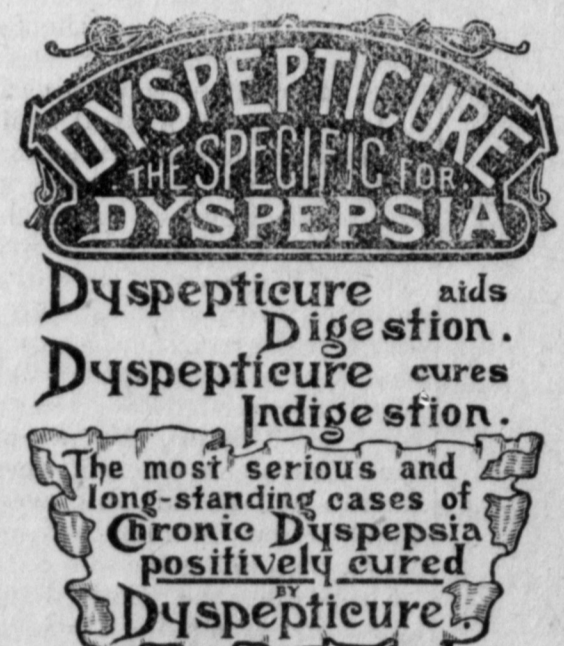

TROUT FISHING.
ATTENTION is called to the following Fishery Regulation:
"In the Province of New Brunswick, no person shall fish for, catch, kill, buy, sell or have in possession any SPECKLED TROUT, LAKE TROUT or LANDLOCKED SALMON, between the 15th day of SEPTEMBER and the 1st day of MAY in each year, both day inclusive, by order.
