### A Shocking Death.

At Acadieville, on Wednesday, an old man named Michael Woods, met a shocking death. The old man, who was 66 years of age, had been up to the residence of a neighboring farmer to get some hay, and on his return followed the railway track. When passing the switch he was struck by the engine of a working train, running tender first, run by Driver E. Haywood. He was knocked some seven or eight feet ahead, falling on the rails and the engine and fourteen cars passed over his body. From the hips down he was literally smashed to pieces and had to be gathered up in a basket. The upper part of the body was not even scratched. Dr. Keith, of Harcourt, acting under instructions from Supt. Rennels, had a jury summoned and repaired to the scene of the accident by a special train and held an inquest. The verdict rendered was that Michael Woods was killed by the engine of the working train and that no blame could be attached to the employees of the railway. A man named John Maloney, who witnessed the accident said that he had been talking to deceased two or three minutes previous to that he did not appear to be the least hard of hearing. Another man said that as he was passing him he cried out to the old man that the train was coming but he apparently did not hear the warning. Woods leaves a wife and seven children, all adults.
