Buctouche Again Scorched.

Another disastrous fire occurred at Buctouche last Thursday night. It broke out at about 11.30, in the interior of the new hotel being erected by Clovis Chase. A heavy north-west wind was blowing and the fire made rapid headway. In a short time the flames had spread to the Bay View barn and stables, Vital Burk's new residence, Jude LeBlanc's house and customs office and the Bay View hotel. Elzear J. L. LeBlanc's store and residence and the frame of George E. Irving's new hotel were the next to ignite, and for a time it looked as if the whole town would be burnt. It was with great difficulty the flames were prevented spreading to the buildings near, namely, C. Burk's hotel and store, A. D. Cormier's store and dwelling, Anthony Gratin's store and dwelling and Isaac W. Carter's dwelling-house and shop. These buildings were several times on fire, but each time the fire was put out. Nearly all the furniture, stock and wearing apparel in the different buildings were destroyed, and so rapid was the progress of the fire that in some instances the occupants barely escaped with their lives. Miss Selina Bourque, in making her exit from her home, had her hair badly singed and her face and hands slightly burned. Leon Legere, who was sleeping in Mr. Trenholm's barn, was badly burned in making his escape through the door. Eight horses perished in the stable. Three of these belonged to Mr. Trenholm, one to Dr. LeBlanc, one to Malcolm Cormier, the mail driver's horse owned by Mr. Weldon, of Shediac, Clovis Chase's "Island Hero" and Mr. Hodge's "Goldie." Mr. Trenholm and Mr. Clarke entered the burning stable through a hole in the north side of the building and cut the animals loose, but it was impossible to get them out.

The loss will be heavy. It is estimated that the value of the property destroyed was in the vicinity of \$12,000. The only insurance so far as can be learned was \$1000 on E. J. L. LeBlanc's building and \$2000 on his stock of goods. Mr. Trenholm's probably the heaviest loser. The loss sustained by Mr. Chase and V. Burke will also be heavy.

The origin of the fire has not been ascertained. Some attribute it to the ignition of some eight or ten casks of unslaked lime which were in the building where the fire started. Others contend that it was the work of incendiaries in the hope of securing plunder. The buildings burned were all put up since the fire last summer, and were two and three story buildings.

Act to Guard Against Forest Fires.

In view of the recent fires in this county we would direct attention to the following section of the Act of 1885 relative to forest fires:—

Sec. 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to set out or cause to be set out, started, or kindled, any fire in or near any forests or woodlands, between the first day of May and the first day of December in any year, except for the purpose of clearing land, cooking, obtaining necessary warmth, or for some necessary industrial purpose, and in case of starting fires for any of the above purposes, the obligations and precautions imposed in the following Sections shall be observed.

2. Every person who shall between the first day of May and the first day of December in any year, make, kindle or start a fire for the purpose of clearing land, shall exercise and observe every reasonable care and precaution in the making and starting of such fire, and in the managing of, caring for and controlling the same after it has been made and started, in order to prevent such fire from spreading and burning up the timber and forests adjoining or in the neighborhood of the place where it has been so made or started, or any fences, crops or improvements upon the land lying adjacent thereto.

5. Every person who shall light, make or start, or cause to be made, lighted or started, a fire on any land not owned by himself, or shall not prevent any fire made, lighted or started on his own land from extending to lands not owned by him, shall, if such fire so extend, and if it be clearly established that such fire has spread in consequence of his negligence, in every case forfeit damages to the Crown or private person as the case may be, injured by said fire, such damages to be in addition to any penalties imposed by this Act.

8. All locomotive engines used on any line of railway which passes in whole or in part through forest or wood lands, shall, by the Company using the same, be provided with and have in use all the most approved and efficient means used to prevent the escape of fire from the furnace or ash pan of such engines, and the smoke stacks of such locomotive engine so used shall be provided with a bonnet or screen of iron or steel wire netting.

12. Whenever any forests, wood lands or barren shall be on fire, it shall be the duty of Supervisors of Roads, Commissioners of Highways, County Councillors, Constables near where such fire is, and each and every one of them, on such fire coming to their notice, to order so many of the men living or residing in the neighborhood of the place where such fire shall be, as they shall severally deem necessary, to proceed to the site of such fire, and there aid in stopping the progress of the same; and any of the above named persons refusing or neglecting to give such order, and any person so ordered refusing to obey the same, shall be liable to a penalty of not less than five dollars and not more than twenty dollars.

18. Any person violating the provisions of this Act, shall be liable to a penalty of not less than twenty dollars and not more than two hundred dollars for each and every offence.

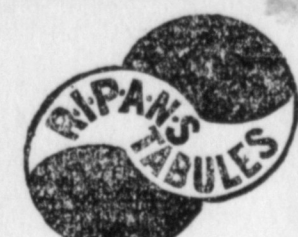

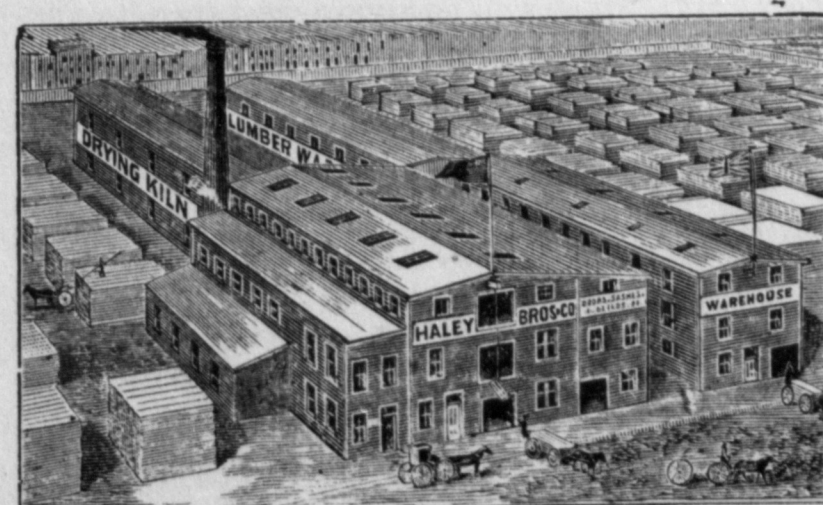
