Complete immigration returns for 1892 show that during the year a total of 36,895 immigrants arrived in the Northwest by way of Port Arthur.

The New York Herald's correspondent at Rio Janeiro telegraphs that a fire in that city last week destroyed a million and a half dollars worth of property.

There is considerable alarm in London regarding Sir John Abbot's health. Sir John is now in Italy, and he says that he feels weaker than when he was in England.

The net debt of the Dominion decreased six hundred and sixteen thousand dollars last month. The surplus of revenue over expenditure for the six months of the current fiscal year is \$4,716,000, an increase of \$800,000 in the month.

Saturday, January 21, has been fixed as the date for the hearing before the Privy Council of the petitions from the Roman Catholics of Manitoba, asking the interference of the Executive in the matter of the abolition of the separate school system by provincial legislation.

William Jenny, aged about 65, committed suicide at Halifax last Thursday by shooting himself with a gun. He had been subject to fits of temporary insanity for some time.

Queen Victoria was among the earliest to congratulate the Hon. William E. Gladstone, on Dec. 29, on the arrival of his eighty-third birthday.

The Governor General has received a largely signed petition from Richmond, Que., asking that the Dominion government take steps to see that justice is done Alexander Mackenzie, a townsman, who will be on trial at Denver, Col., on January 16 for robbing the mails.

The Temperance Hall in Dundee, in which the people of that vicinity have for many years assembled for public worship, was a short time ago burned to the ground.

Public examination of the following schools, have been held. Black Land, Mr. Coleman, teacher; New Mills, Miss Chiff, teacher; Black Point, Miss Harvie, teacher; and Louison Brook, Mr. Carmichael, teacher.

As there is now a sufficient quantity of snow, the portable shingle mills are in full operation. The shingle mills on the shore did some good work last season.

A few weeks ago they were closed on account of the ice. There are about sixty machines in the various mills, and a large number of shingles are manufactured.
