Since the Greek Bishop Bryennios found Biblical literature are equal in worth to that of the fragments of a Gospel attributed to the Apostle St Peter, unearthed some time ago in the City of the Dead Akhmim, the Old Panopolis. The manuscript is written on parchment, and has been published by U. Bouriant, the Director of the French Archaeological Institute in Cairo. This document, which is now in the Museum at Gizeh, is of thirty-three pages. in Old leather binding. It is not dated, but the othography and writing show that it is not older than the eighth, and not younger than the twelfth, century. It was found in an old Christian cemetery. On the first page is a sign, doubtless representing the Coptic cross ; to the right and left are the letters Alpha and Omega. On the back, the text itself begins at what attributed to St. Peter.
