BATHURST, June 9.—Rev. Mr. Seller resumed his testimony this morning and on the stand all day. He said Dr. Inch's letter indicated a policy of delay on the part of the board of education in dealing with the protest of the Protestants, and that on their behalf he advertised in The Sun of February 22nd for a teacher for a private school.

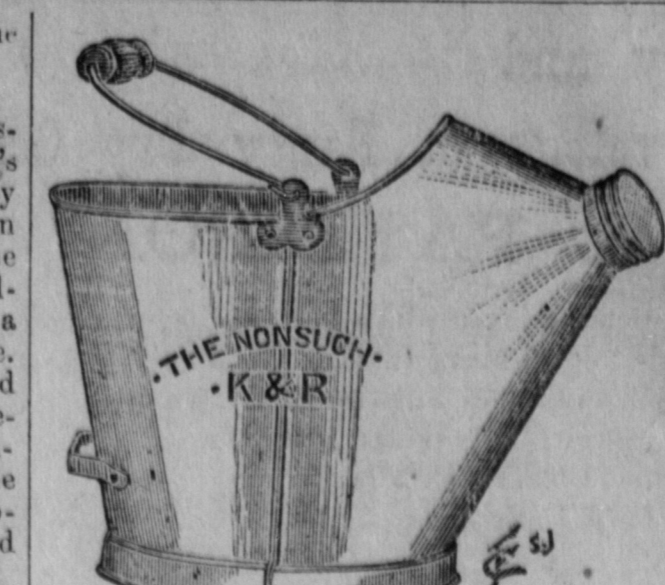

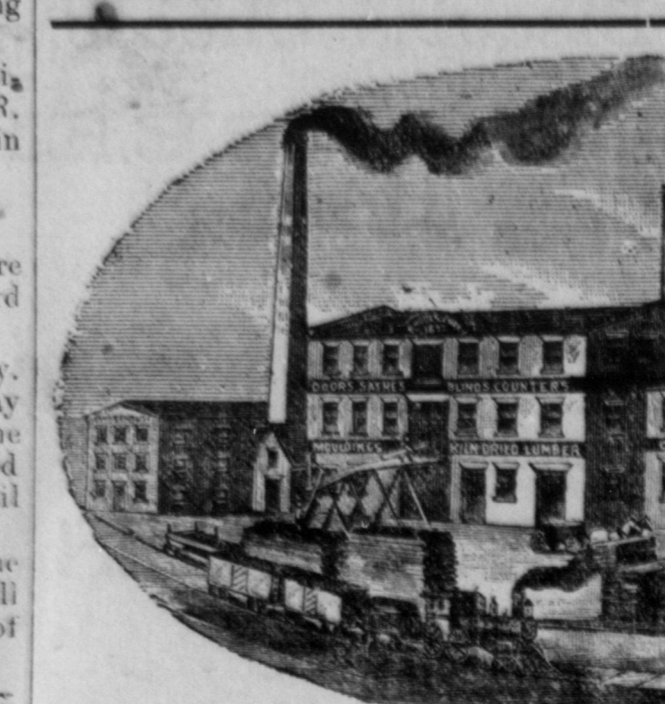

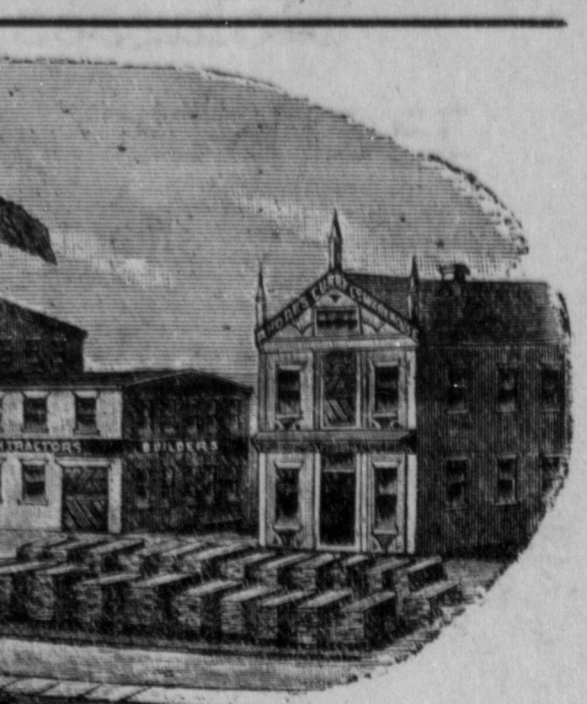
