The Pall Mall Gazette says the Behring Sea arbitrators have decided in favor of Great Britain in every point at issue in the dispute, jurisdiction, proprietorship, etc. The decision does not recognize the United States' claim of jurisdiction in Behring Sea, based on Russian rights.
