Thursday, April 6th, three car loads of effects and a number of new settlers went north. On Friday, April 7th, two special trains went out from Calgary carrying 100 settlers and 23 cars of effects. On Saturday there arrived at Calgary 200 settlers and 50 cars of effects, all bound for northern Alberta. The latter were from Ontario; the preceding arrivals being a completely equipped colony from Nebraska, besides some from Minnesota, Washington and Idaho. There had previously arrived about 100 settlers from the Maritime Provinces, who went principally to the Edmonton district, though some went to Pincher Creek in the most southern part of Alberta. Probably 200 to 300 besides those named have arrived this spring in small parties or separately. Many hundreds of others are known to be on their way. Mayor Lucas of Calgary, who has just spent three months in Ontario, says that some 600 from that quarter will come at once to Alberta; and Mr. J. G. Fitzgerald, who has spent a couple of months in Washington, Idaho and Oregon, issued while there 600 certificates to intending emigrants entitling them to special rates over the C. P. R., and fresh applications for these certificates were pouring in.
