The tepid or warm morning bath is a great improvement over the cold-water bath, but even these are not to be commended. Whoever would enjoy the best of health should take his bath two or three or four times a week, and retire to bed for a rest, thereby allowing nature to secure the best equilibrium of her forces and promote the best conditions of health.

But no bath should be taken while the patient is weary from labor or excitement. Rest if then indicated.
