A young and gallant knight from the classic land of Arabia, whose Oriental name has perhaps been lost in his wanderings and now answers to the pugilistic name of the world's heavy weight champion, has created a sensation by loving, not wisely the daughter of a respectable citizen.

The typical cruel parent objected to our hero swinging on his garden gate, whether owing to his weight—200 pounds—or his impetuosity is not known. 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

The Plague. LONDON, July 26.—Details of the ravages of cholera in Mecca received today are more terrible than the stories from the plague-infected districts of Russia last year. Mecca is indescribably filthy, there being no sewerage system, while stagnant water is found in the cellars of the poor. The horrible condition of affairs is, therefore, not likely to be remedied. Dr. Chaffey, Egyptian delegate to the sanitary council of Alexandria, reports that the number of deaths are more than twice the official figures. There were 135,000 pilgrims in Mecca, when cholera broke out. At least 10 per cent died, besides a large proportion of the native population of 60,000. He adds that at Mecca it has been impossible to bury the dead, who were piled in different places in the neighborhood. In Mahmal were also found a number of bodies unburied. Returning from Mecca to Mecca, the route was strewn with corpses, many in an advanced state of decomposition. In the interior of Mecca bodies were lying in a state of putrefaction. When it was decided to carry them to the country they were left there three days unburied, owing to the absence of a sufficient number of grave diggers. The efforts to prevent the spread of the disease have amounted to nothing.

Ill Results of Early Rising. A German doctor has discovered that the majority of the people who live long sit up late at night. Eight-tenths of the people who reach 80 never (so he says) go to bed until the small hours and take care not to get up until the day is well aired. Not only is it a very fine thing to go to bed late, but it is correspondingly dangerous to get up early. "Early rising," says the doctor, "tends to exhaust the physical powers and to shorten life." Indeed, if you have got the wrong kind of a constitution for early rising the practice may carry you off in the flower of youth.


