**PROVINCIAL NEWS.**  
Hon. A. S. White, solicitor general, has been elected by acclamation.

The only New Brunswick grant in the supplementary estimates is \$6,000 for Partridge Island wharf, St. John; \$5,000 is granted for dredging in the maritime provinces; \$1,200 is set down as an additional amount for medical attendance of Nova Scotia Indians. A gratuity of \$1,000 is given Mr. Mowat, who was seriously injured by the explosion of a barrel of varnish at Campbellton station.

There is a growing opinion in conservative circles that at the close of the present session the government will settle the New Brunswick Governorship deadlock by appointing Sir Leonard Tilley for another term, dating the appointment back a couple of years. Senator Boyd's friends claim to have a majority of the members from New Brunswick backing their man, while the Burns party say they have a majority of the Cabinet.

A young man named William Wright belonging to Carlisle, Carleton county, and working in the woods on the Southwest Miramichi, met with a sad death last week. While chopping during the forenoon he accidentally slashed one of his feet with the axe, inflicting a horrible wound. A companion at once attempted to stop the bleeding. His endeavors proving futile, the injured man after a time was started to Hartland, the residence of the nearest physician, but just as he reached the doctor's residence he died.

Thursday morning the store owned by M. & J. Hickey Chatham, was discovered to be on fire and was completely destroyed together with its contents, some \$3,000 worth of groceries, boots and shoes, cloth and liquors. The insurance on the building was \$1,000. There was nothing on the stock. The Muirhead building was completely gutted. Wm. Richards, Capt. J. J. Brown (shipping master), J. Fotheringham, Mrs. Bridget's and J. P. McNaught's furniture was partially destroyed. There was no insurance on the building or the tenants' furniture. The post office roof was partially burned also.

**GENERAL NEWS.**  
Mr. Sedgewick, has been appointed judge of the Supreme Court of Canada.  
The Supreme Court dismissed the appeal in the case of Ellis vs. the Queen, holding that the court had no jurisdiction.  
In the British House of Commons Friday the Home Rule bill was read a first time. The second reading was fixed for March 13th.

A disastrous fire took place at Montreal Monday. It destroyed Mullen's block, in which Smarten's shoe factory and several other firms were located. The total loss is put at \$150,000.

A letter has been received from New Metakaahita, Alaska, giving particulars of a fire there Feb. 7th. 28 houses were burned, and the people are suffering from lack of clothing and shelter.  
The Manitoba provincial government is arranging with a line of steamers to bring out two thousand Icelanders next summer. It is not unlikely that the entire population of Iceland, more than sixty thousand souls, will be taken to Manitoba.

Justin McCarthy, Timothy Healey and other Irish nationalists have issued an address to the friends of Ireland in the United States, Canada and Australia asking moral and financial aid in their endeavor to secure the passage of Gladstone's home rule bill.

Professor Charles G. D. Roberts of Kings college, Windsor, has been selected as one of the literary arbiters of the World's Fair. He is the only Canadian on the board, which is composed of twelve. This position will be considered an honor when such men as Gladstone and Tennyson were two of the four selected from England.

The Acadian Recorder says.—The investigation in the matter of A. D. Cameron's death at Bridgetown, has developed nothing to incriminate his wife in connection with it. The whole thing appears to have been "engineered" almost altogether as a newspaper "sensation," in an attempt to imitate the "style" in vogue in the lowest type of blood-and-thunder publications in the United States.

On Monday a fishing boat went down with nine occupants in a storm off Hanff on the Scotch coast. Two fishing boats foundered in the storm off Wick that afternoon and all of the 19 men in the boats were drowned. A terrific storm swept the Northeast coast of Scotland since early in the morning and much wreckage drifted ashore. Reports of small losses of life at various points are received hourly.

Mr. Angers, minister of agriculture, has been advised from Washington that the enforcement of 90 days' quarantine in regard to the Canadian thoroughbred cattle intended for the World's Fair had been rescinded. So acute was the feeling engendered by the recent order to quarantine exhibition cattle for 90 days that several Canadian manufacturers withdrew their applications for space in the Canadian section of the Fair.

The president sent a message to the senate on the 15th inst. recommending the annexation of the Hawaiian Islands to the United States, accompanied by a treaty of annexation concluded between the secretary of state and the Hawaiian commissioner. The treaty provides merely for the present provisional government, leaving the details of a permanent form of government, etc., to the action of congress.

A despatch from Brisbane, Austria, says:—The water is thirty feet deep in the principal streets of the city tonight. In the suburbs the water has covered buildings sixty feet high. Five hundred houses have been demolished. Hundreds of families who have lost their homes have left the city in boats for higher ground. All gas and water pipes are destroyed and the city is in darkness. All towns between Brisbane and Ipswich are submerged. This is the greatest disaster in the history of this colony.

Mr. Burns, M. P., is urging the government to examine the coal deposits near Shippegan and Caraqueit harbors with a view to determine their extent. One seam of 16 inches has already been struck. Mr. Burns believes that this source of supply will make the Intercolonial independent of the Nova Scotia mines altogether. Samples of the coal have been tested and pronounced equal to the best English. A member of the geological staff will probably be sent to examine the find.

The Star cable says: London, Feb. 20.—Edward Blake's speech in the house of commons Friday night was much applauded in the house and in the press. Leonard Courtney, a unionist, and the deputy speaker who followed Mr. Blake, voiced the feelings of Mr. Blake's friends and of many of the latter's foes when he referred admiringly to the character and ability displayed in the speech of Mr. Blake. Mr. Courtney expressed the belief that Mr. Blake would in time reach a position equal to that occupied by him in Canada. The Canadian's speech is expected to hurry Mr. Blake's election as the man to lead the Irish party. In this way it is hoped that the Parallellites and anti-Parallellites will be united.
