Catholic Study of Scripture.



His Holiness has devoted inquiry especially to the diverse opinions of savants on great biblical questions. He will proceed to indite a letter to bishops requiring them to enjoin upon their flocks a more profound study of the scriptures, and a larger place in the schools for the study of critical ex-

planation of hermeneutics. The Pope urges the necessity of keeping in the track of modern progress and discovery, in order to adapt Catholicism to the needs of the day.


