GENERAL NEWS.

A despatch from Panama says Campedan valley, Guatemala, has been flooded; six villages were swept away; hundreds of people are reported drowned.

A movement is on foot in the southern states looking to an exodus of the negroes to all parts of the west.

Both houses of the Washington Legislature have passed a bill making it unlawful in that state to manufacture, buy, sell, or give away, cigarettes or cigarette papers.

Mr. Goldwin Smith, in speaking at the St. George's Society meeting in Washington, was severe on the motion made by the Toronto Society to expel him, and declared that he would not be gagged.

The Supplementary civil service estimates contain an item of £20,600 for the compensation of Behring Sea sealers for loss due to the delay in arranging a modus vivendi in 1891.

Jules Ferry was elected president of the Senate on Feb 24 by a majority of 148 votes.

The question of woman suffrage came up in the Manitoba Legislature last week.

Hon. Mr. DeBruere, of Quebec, calculates that 3,094 families, embracing 15,450 persons in all, have returned to settle down in their native provinces during the past year.

Lord Rosebery says the depression in Australia and the home rule excitement make it undesirable to summon another Colonial Conference on the Imperial Federation question at present.

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A big debate on prohibition was concluded in the Manitoba Legislature Thursday night, when a vote was taken on the proposal of the Government to memorialize the Dominion Government asking power to pass a prohibitory law.

Mr. Acland, while promising to help Welshmen in their desire for more attention being paid to the native language in the schools of the Principality, put in a plea for better tuition in English.
