There is very little honey upon the market this year, either in comb or extracted.

A large capital is not necessary to be successful with bee-keeping; one should have a love for bees and a good location where there is plenty of honey-producing plants in the vicinity.

A writer in the Bee-Keeper's Guide says that he thinks his bees need salt as much as the horses, hogs or cattle, and he keeps a supply of water that has been slightly salted near them, and they prefer it to fresh water.

A writer in Bee-keeper's Review says if bees are wintered in the cellar they should be put there about Nov. 10 to 20, and the cellar should be dry, well ventilated, pure and sweet, and should be kept at a temperture of forty-five degrees. If wintered on their summer stands they should be in chaff-packed hives, with good roof that will exclude snow or rain.






