

parings, especially during the winter. The best profit from eggs is in the winter, and good treatment must be given to secure them.



Got Away With \$7,000.

PORT HURON, Mich., Dec. 22 .- One of he boldest and most daring robberies that ever occurred in this vicinity was perpetrated at the Canadian express office at Sarnia Tuesday, when \$7,000 were taken out of the safe in the office while the clerk was at dinner. The robbers made good their escape, apparently without leaving a single clue.

Thomas Cook, Jr., agent of the company, has been sick abed for the last few days and the office was in charge of James McMahon. At 12.25 o'clock McMahon locked everything valuable in the office safe, which is an old-fashioned keylock affair, and after locking the front door went for his dinner. Upon his return, at five minutes before one, he found the door of the safe open with a key sticking in the keyhole and \$7,000 in currency missing.


