Brewer, Maine.

To the Editor of The Review:
You will kindly excuse me if I take the liberty to write you, to give your readers an account of the little city of Brewer in which I am now residing.
Brewer is situated on the east side of Penobscot river, directly opposite Bangor, and is one of the most important and active powers in the state of Maine. At the upper end of the town, opposite the Maine Central Depot there is a large planing mill, and a butter factory, which gives employment to forty men during the season. About two yards below it is another large planing mill, and Sash and Door factory, together with a large ice house from which there are from fifty to sixty thousand tons of ice shipped yearly to the West Indies. This establishment is owned by E. & H. Rollins & Co., of Brewer, Me. They employ from seventy-five to one hundred hands during the season.
A quarter of a mile below are the Dirigo Lumber mills, owned by Gould & Hastings, where a large amount of lumber is manufactured during the season. A short distance down river is another large ice house owned by E. & I. K. Stetson & Co., together with a coal yard and a ship railway, where large ships or steamers are hauled up for repairs. Down river about three-quarters of a mile we find one of the best lumber mills in the state of Maine. It is owned by F. W. Ayer & Co. There are three band saws in the mill that cut on an average about 85 thousand a day each. The same company owns a large pulp mill close to the saw mill, where all the slabs and rubbish from the mill are conveyed by elevators and turned into pulp. They employ from two hundred to three hundred hands.
A little below is another saw mill, with two band saws and shingle and clapboard machines, where lumber is manufactured on a large scale. It is owned by D. Sargent & Sons, of Bangor.
Times are going to be pretty dull here this winter, and wages low. The lumbermen are not going in as strong this winter as they generally do, and all that is paid for hands now is from \$15 to \$20.
Times are dull all over the United States now on account of the silver question, and every day there are car loads of people coming from Boston and other parts of the States through Bangor and Brewer looking for work.

The Fishery Bounty.
An order in council is being distributed which presents some new regulations regarding the terms on which bounty will be granted to fishermen. The following contain the most important changes and they will somewhat restrict the number of persons receiving bounty:
"No bounty shall be paid on fish caught with gill-nets, set at a distance of less than two miles from shore, or with trap-nets, pound-nets and weirs.
"Only one claim will be allowed in each season, even though the claimant may have fished in two vessels, or in a vessel and a boat, or in two boats.
"The owners of boats measuring not less than thirteen feet keel which have been engaged during a period of not less than three months in deep sea fishing for fish other than shell-fish, salmon or shad, or fish taken in rivers or mouths of rivers, shall be entitled to a bounty on each such boat."
