WOMAN'S SUFFRAGE.

Woman suffrage has recently gained a great victory in Colorado. At the election in that state on the 7th instant an amendment to the constitution of the state giving women precisely the same rights of suffrage as men, was voted on and adopted by a majority of about 5000.

The Conservatives encountered a severe defeat in Winnipeg last week. The constituency was opened by the resignation of Hugh John McDonald who was elected at the last general election by a majority of five hundred and nine.

The shipping firm of Troop & Sons, the oldest house in St. John, is reported to be in financial difficulties. This firm has for years done the largest business in shipping in the province, but of late they have been experiencing some hard luck.

A London cable says: Some of Mr. Gladstone's friends and colleagues in the house must have noticed with uneasiness that both on Thursday and Friday afternoons he seemed to be quite wearied out before the dinner hour and fell fast asleep in his seat.

In predicting the result of an election it is not always safe to base calculations on the result of the previous contest. The city of Winnipeg, which elected a Conservative in 1891 by a majority of 500, has gone Liberal less than three years later by a majority of 438.

The new United States tariff bill has been made public. The bill puts wool, coal, lumber, salt and iron on the free list

and reduces the duty on sugar from one-half to one-quarter cent per pound. As a rule the tariff has been made lowest upon the cheaper goods of necessary use, and left highest upon more expensive articles.

The attempt made by the son of ex-premier Mercier and two other young Frenchmen to blow up the Nelson monument in Montreal with dynamite has awakened the British public to the fact that the province of Quebec is as yet only a British colony in name.
