Paper by J. B. Clarke, of Bass River, Read Before the Kent County Teacher's Institute.

I have chosen as my subject, "The importance of teaching temperance in our schools," not because of a belief in my ability to deal properly with the subject, but because I think it a question of vital importance which should be discussed in our Institute.

Our schools are no longer considered merely as places for storing the minds of pupils with a certain amount of knowledge. They are looked upon as places for fitting the youth of our land to become useful members of society.

Now, Temperance is admittedly the great elevator of morals, and should therefore rank first in our Course of Instruction, and should be taught from a scientific, moral and economic standpoint.

It should be taught from a scientific standpoint that our pupils may learn the nature of alcohol and alcoholic liquors, that they may know their effects upon the organs and tissues of the human body.

When these have been taught thoroughly, our pupils have learned something worth knowing. They have learned how useless alcoholics are in all, and how injurious in most cases in which they are introduced into the human system.

But the mere science of Temperance, important though it be, is not far-reaching enough. The subject should also be treated of upon a moral basis. We should particularly emphasize the degrading influence of strong drink.

him, but alas! too late. He can no longer restrain his appetite. He has enrolled his name and is on his way to join the army and cannot now turn back.

There is another phase of the question which I wish to notice. That is the economic and business side of the question. The labourer, the mechanic, the merchant and the professional man has each his place to fill in society, and his influence is felt in proportion to his success.

Intemperance has its direful effects upon all of them. It weakens the laborer's arm, unnerves the mechanic's hand muddles the brain of the merchant and the professional man, and thus hinders the highest success of each.

Then there is the waste caused through intemperance. What large quantities of grain, which should feed the hungry are used in the manufacture of alcoholics.

The consumption of alcoholic liquors in the Dominion of Canada for 1891, is given as 4 1/2 gallons per capita, on an estimated population of five millions, which would make over 21 millions of gallons.

Considering that most of this is sold by the glass, two dollars would be a low estimate. Allowing that, we have the enormous sum of forty-two millions of dollars expended for strong drink in Canada for that year.

These facts forcibly presented cannot fail to interest our pupils and so materially aid our cause.

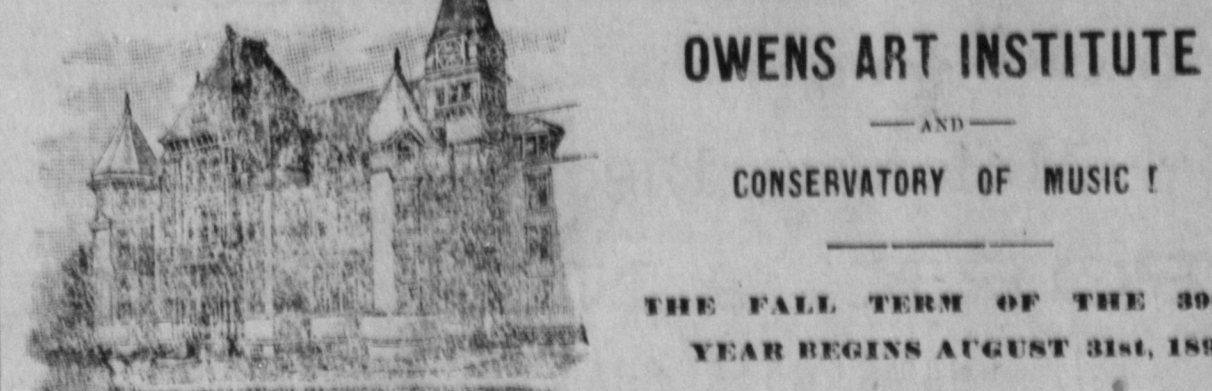
