QUEBEC, Nov. 21.—Hon. Honore Mercier spoke to day for the first time for publication about the attempt to blow up the Nelson monument, but he did not talk much. MONTRÉAL, Nov. 21.—The Star cable says: London, Nov. 21.—All papers published full and graphic accounts of the attempted outrage on the Nelson monument on Jacques Cartier square, Montreal. Reports of the affair were in some cases side by side with the lecture delivered by Prof. William Lecky, before the Prince of Wales, at the Imperial Institute, last evening, when he referred to England's generous treatment of the French, and also emphasized the fact that French-Canadians were loyal to the British flag.

The Pall Mall Gazette says that the outrage is of a peculiarly offensive character. The French-Canadians, the article continues, have received most considerate treatment under British rule and have no grievances, and have no hope or wish to come under French protection, and detest the idea of annexation to the United States. However, the paper continues, it is only the wilder headed among them who insult the memory of a national hero of the English speaking race. In conclusion it adds that if there is any strong revulsion in the Dominion of Canada against French Canadians the responsibility rests with those most ungrateful citizens who profit by English protection and insult everything that Englishmen cherish.
