—The large coal sheds at Newcastle,
along with their contents—1,500 tons of
coal have been destroyed by fire.

—The Melancon property at Black
River was sold at public auction Tuesday.

—The Anherst car works have received
an order for ten box and four flat cars for
the Buctouche and Moncton railway.—
Times.

—The death of Mr. Robert McLelland,
at Galloway, Sunday, removes another of
the old inhabitants of this section. Mr.
McLelland was well and favorably known
all over the County.

—The Grand Division, S. of T., con-
cluded its session at Newcastle on Thurs-
day evening. The semi-annual session
will be held at Bathurst in May and the
annual session at Sussex in October.

—The Royal Hotel, of Moncton, is pro-

province. The proprietor is to be con-

—The Victoria Hotel, Buctouche, is
reaping a grand harvest. The past two
weeks every room, and at times every
lounge, have been occupied. The popular
proprietor, A. Hannigan, has lately built
a large addition to his barn and made
other necessary improvements, and the
travelling public are realizing that Mr.

Hannigan is endeavoring to accommodate
them in all possible ways.

—A Campbellton despatch says: Ex-
tensive preparations are being made for
smelt fishing. Already some fishermen
are at work on the Quebec side, where the
season opens earlier than in New Brun-
swick and where seining is allowable. J.
P. Mowatt expects to ship four hundred
thousand pounds this winter. It is said
that some Miramichi fishermen are com-
ing up here to fish this season.

—In the Theriault murder trial at
Andover, the jury returned a verdict of
manslaughter with a recommendation to
mercy. Thereupon the judge sentenced
the prisoner to five years in the peniten-
tiary. On motion of Mr. Gregory execu-
tion of the sentence was stayed till
December first to allow him to apply to
the Attorney General for a writ so that
the matter might be argued before the
bench.

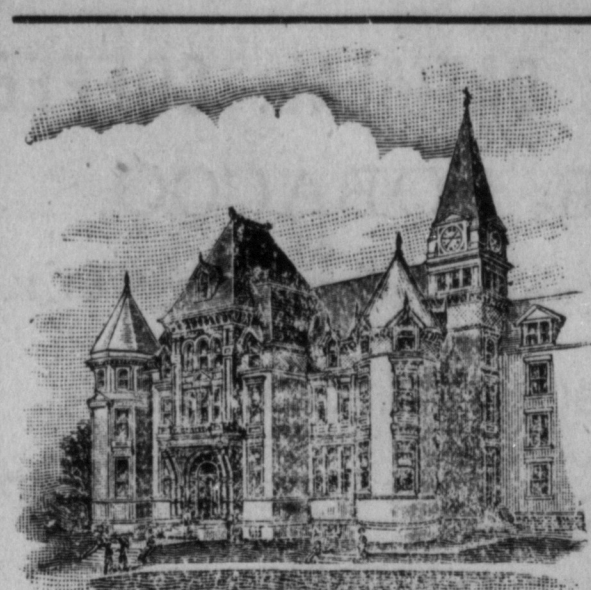
—As the Buctouche and Moncton train,
at the rate of 25 miles an hour, was
approaching Irishtown station Tuesday
morning, a little girl, aged fourteen years,
daughter of Amos Campbell, jumped off
the rear car. She was thrown a consider-
able distance and fell in a ditch. She pick-
ed up in a semi-unconscious condition and
found to be cut badly about the head,
face and body. It is feared she is
internally injured.

—Breaking the record.—We broke the
record on Saturday. Sales the largest,

Patrick Calahan, a young Irishman, went
out on it to make a break, but unfortun-
ately slipped through and was drowned.
The body had not been found up to
Thursday evening. Calahan was a native
of Miramichi, New Brunswick, and was
about 23 years of age. The rise and fall
of the water in DeBERT River is very rapid
and the velocity of the surging waters
terrible. It is possible that the body may
have become lodged in one of the many
deep holes in the stream.—Times.
