Judge Goggin, of Chicago, does up the Common Law.

[From the Inter-Ocean.]

"Gentlemen, I want to say that there is no reform in civilization that has arisen through law. All that ever came was from revolution. Mr. Hallam, who is, perhaps, the best writer upon English law, says that the common law of England, with this chancery appendage, is the vilest code ever imposed upon humanity. It seems as if we in this country follow the precepts of that common robber, Pope, and that sanctimonious creature, Sir Matthew Hale, and do not know, even now, whether we war to cross the country in a so-called prairie schooner or a palace car. You lawyers come into court and ask a Judge to decide cases dealing with the rights of corporations by that ancient law of the time of the imperative Tudors which has continued through the successive families of the rulers of Great Britain. All due

respect to the Prince of Wales. "Take the case of the woman mentioned by Dickens in 'Barnaby Rudge' who merely entered a shop and took up a piece of linen to look at it. She was arrested and hanged. They took the baby from her breast. Other cases might be mentioned of the learned juries' and judges' actions and the attempts of judges to declare that a shilling was only worth ten pence. It is from extracts from the old laws of these times that lawyers ask that a case affecting the people of Chicago be decided. Mobbed French Priests.

VICTORIA. B C., September 7.—The North China Daily News of August 2, received by the steamer "Empress of from Hankow, under date of July 20 :- day morning under the Holliday house. News has arrived of the destruction by a mob of the French Roman Catholic chapel in the town of Genkiawana, near the city of Mien-Yang, about one hundred miles west of Hankow. The foreign priests in charge escaped to the neighboring town. No lives were lost, though several native houses shared in the destruction. The French Consul is enquiring into the cir-

Japan has during the past month experienced fires and earthquakes. The entire village of Lyenokami, in Tamba province, was burned on August 16, and sixty-five lives were lost. The village of Hon Tomari, Kitami province, was destroyed twelve days previously, one hundred and twenty-four houses being consumed, but without a fatality. On August 6th the town of Hakozaki, Fukuowa prefecture, comprising sixty houses, were also destroyed, and upwards of two hnndred persons were endered homeless.

Other disasters in the Orient were An explosion in the Yabarana coal mines, near Sorachi, by which nineteen persons were killed. On August 21 eleven pilgrims lost their lives during a storm while ascending Mount Frip. The district of Tung Chow, near Pekin, was flooded, in consequence of heavy rains, causing great loss of life and doing much damage to property. Chinese pirates recently captured the steamer of the Chinese consulate at Penang, killing twenty-four persons booty to the amount of \$20,000.
