NEWCASTLE, Sept. 7 .- Coroner Dr. Francis Desmond of Newcastle began an inquest on the remains of Miss Morrison yesterday. The jury are : E. Lee Street (fcreman), W. A. Hickson, Donald Morrison, Alex. Stewart, John Clarke, and J. H. Phinney.

The coroner and jury proceeded in the forenoon to the house of Mr. Morrison, where the body lay, and examined it. It was crushed at the abdomen. They next visited Kerr's mill wharf, where the fatality occurred, and examined the surroundings.

At three o'clock the enquiry was continued in Dr. Desmond's office.

Samuel Thom, son, Q. C., represented the crown, and Hon. M. Adams was there in the interests of Mr. Morrison, father of the disceased.
