License Versus No License. (Continued from last week.) It would, however be a thousand times better for those who patronize him, and for their families, if the dealer gave them bits of card-board, or tissue paper, or some worthless object for the money paid him. Bits of card-board would never have produced the sad hearts, the wrecked lives his equivalent produces. Bits of tissue paper would never have filled our almshouses, our jails, our penitentiaries, our lunatic asylums, would never have caused the crime, the misery, the woe, that is caused by that which the licensed liquor dealer gives as an equivalent for the one thousand dollars paid him.

We will now suppose that the year has expired. Let us see how the account stands at its close. Ten licensed liquor dealers pay twenty dollars each into the funds of the County Treasurer. Ten times twenty dollars make two hundred dollars. Ten licensed liquor dealers collect from the people one thousand dollars each, upon which to subsist during the year. Ten times one thousand dollars make ten thousand dollars. Total collected from the people at least ten thousand two hundred dollars. Amount paid into the Treasury to go to the credit of the Parish two hundred dollars. Amount taken from the people to go into the till of the licensed dealer ten thousand dollars. Without license the people could have paid this two hundred dollars into the Treasury and could have saved the ten thousand dollars.

I have put the amount at the very smallest figure. While there are very few if any, fall under the one thousand dollars, the majority of licensed dealers go far above it, some far up into the thousands. Who then pays the license fee? Most assuredly the people do and for the privilege of paying it first to the saloon keeper, they pay in addition, fifty times as much. But I hear someone saying "They don't all belong to our parish or our town, who patronize our saloons." That may be, and probably is true. But if people from other places come here and drink, then our people, who drink, when they visit other places, will patronize the saloons there, so in that respect the account is kept balanced.

No greater imposition was ever practised upon a free people than the idea that a license granted a person to sell intoxicating liquors, ever did, ever can, or ever will, enrich the community granting the license. Let the tax payers of this parish ponder then, ere they ask the Municipal Council to license any man to collect, at least, fifty times as much from the people as he pays into the treasury of the County, especially since the value given for this money is more fatal in its effects than the ravages of disease, reaching out beyond time, into the drunkard's eternity.

The London Lancet is one of the best medical authorities, and boys who think that their parents are old-fashioned and behind the times because they object to cigarette smoking, may be interested in what the Lancet says about the use of tobacco by growing lads: "It is time," this authority says, "that the attention of all responsible persons should be seriously directed to the prevention of the evil."

lence and increase of tobacco smoking among boys. 'Stunted growth, impaired digestion, palpitation and other evidences of nerve exhaustion and irritability have again and again impressed a lesson on abstinence which has hitherto been too little regarded. A further stage of warning has been reached in a case which lately came before the coroner of Liverpool. A lad was in the habit of smoking cigarettes and cigar ends, and after an attack of sickness died somewhat suddenly. The post-mortem examinations revealed fatty changes in the heart, which there is little doubt, as the verdict held, had been fatally supplemented in their influence by the smoking habit referred to.

This, of course, is an extreme example. It is also, however, after all, only the strongly colored illustration of effects upon health which are daily realized in thousands of instances. We have no hesitation in asserting once more our conviction, that it is incumbent upon the legislature, in view of the known pernicious effect upon mind and body during boyhood, to restrict this habit to an age limit, which will fall outside this period.
