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

The following tabulated statement from of New Brunswick in 1881 and 1891 :-



It will be seen from this statement that the increase in the Acadian population has been altogether in the North Shore counties. The remaining counties of the province show a decrease. The county of Victoria (which includes Madawaska for census purposes) is the only St. John river county having any large body of French, and here the French population has decreased 1103. Restigouche shows an increase of 711, Gloucester 3244, Northumberland 567, Kent 1896 and Westmorland 1878 The increase in the English population in the same time has been in Restigouche 539, Gloucester 39, Northumberland 97 and Westmorland 1880. The English population of Kent decreased 669 in the ten years.


