

Captain Lang, of the British gunboat Sirius, declined to convey him to sea, for fear, he said, that a drunken Government or insurgent gunner might fire on the bark and thus get the British Government in international difficulties. No doubt the Black might have still been at Rio had it not been for the Liverpool tug Blazer,

which towed him past the rebel ships and Government ports to sea for £25.

Captain Buck says that the American schooner, J. A. Simpson, had twelve shots fired near her stern while at anchor in the harbor one morning, when Captain Benner. the schooner's commander, was going ashore in a small boat. The shots nearly killed all hands and almost wrecked the vessel. The Government wanted to apologize the next day, but Captain Benner refused to accept the apology, and sent States cruiser Charleston.
