HALLOWEEN SHOOTING AFFAIR.

Fatally Shot.

Florian LeBlanc, of Cocagne Probably (Times.) All Halloween at Cocagne was marked by an unfortunate shooting affair whereby the life of a young man named Florian LeBlanc, son of Peter LeBlanc, hangs in the balance. It appears that on the evening in question Florian LeBlanc, in company with his brother and Patrick Hayes, left his father's house about seven o'clock in the evening to have a little amusement in a harmless sort of way and wandered in the direction of the village schoolhouse. On arrival there the young men were confronted by Theodore Gogain and his son, neighbors. The father was armed with a rifle and the young men to evade him dodged into the schoolnouse, which was found to be open. Gogain who was one of the trnstees of the district, it seems, was on the spot for the purpose of preventing an outhouse that was being course tackled the first person to come a shot, the bullet boring a hole through the window on one side of the house and out the other. 

LeBlanc was standing with his back towards the door about four or five feet or pains in the limbs, of any description. distant and the ball struck the exterior part of the shoulder blade, touching the upper part of the lung and coming out above the collar bone. With a cry that terrified his companions LeBlanc fell heavily to the floor as if dead. His companions raised him up and immediately started for home, and they state that Gogain, not content with what he had already done followed them in company with his son, beating the injured man and themselves with sticks. A messenger wahastily dispatched for Dr. Belliveau, of Shediac, who reached the scene of the shooting about 12 o'clock at night. The doctor found young LeBlanc in a very weak condition but he did all that was possible to alleviate his sufferings. Dr. Belliveau again visited his patient yesterday and found him in a feverish state and his condition alarming. He entertains little hope for the injured man's recovery. Great indignation is felt in the section where the shooting occurred at the action of Gogain, who is a well to do farmer, but whose disposition is not of the best. Johnson, at Cocagne, charged with wilfully and maliciously shooting Florian LeBlanc, Dr. Belliveau was the only witness examined. He testified to the character of the wound. The prisoners were remanded to bail until the ninth inst. to await the result of the wound. Bail was fixed at \$2000. Dr. White says the present condition of the wounded man is good but the outlook is bad. Pieces of clothing and parts of a scapular hanging from the neck were driven into the lungs and all may not have been removed.

SHEDIAC, Nov. 4.—The young man who was shot at Cocagne Tuesday night, is somewhat improved and seems to be gaining strength. Gogain has been arrested and is out on bail. Mr. W. A. Russell of Shediac, has been engaged to defend
