M. Velimirovitch, formerly Serbian minister of justice was found dead in his residence at Belgrade, Wednesday. His head was severed from his body, which was horribly mutilated. Money and valuables were stolen from the house. It is believed the principal motive for the crime was of a political character.

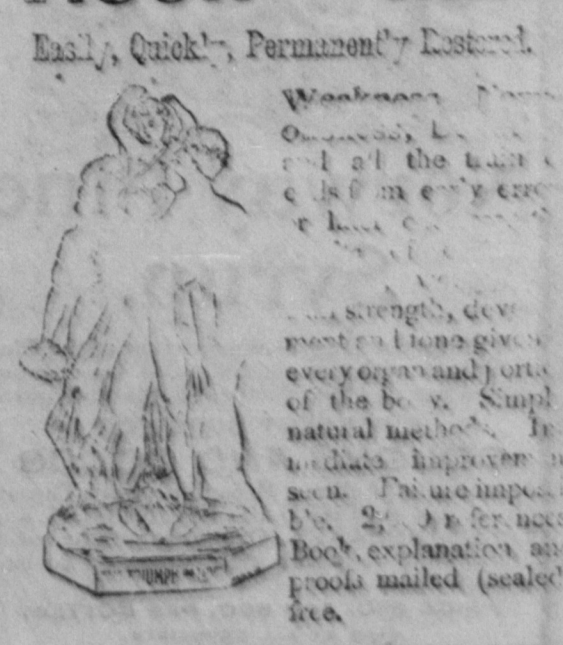
There is a big sensation in regard to World's Fair awards. Executive Commissioner Lark claims to have secured evidence of gross frauds in connection with the agricultural implement awards, by which the Dominion competitors were deprived of between ten and fifteen medals. He has entered a protest and demands a re-examination. Evidence is being arranged and Lark will soon present it.

The excitement caused by the finding of the bomb in London has subsided. The former owner of the boom readily explained the circumstance. He picked it up on one of the Franco-Prussian battlefields a long time ago and kept it as a relic. He was afraid of it, and desired to get rid of it, thinking it might some day explode. Last Wednesday he carried it to Westminster bridge and threw it, as he supposed, into the river. In falling it landed on a battress, where its finding resulted in the starting of a dynamite scare.

A terrible tragedy was enacted at Halifax Tuesday morning which has caused a sensation throughout the city. Three months ago a Mrs. Savage, aged about 25, and her little boy about five, came here from New York and took lodgings in a house on Barrington street, where she engaged in dressmaking. She was making a very good living and was apparently contented. Last night a man called at the house and enquired for Mrs. Savage. He was the woman's husband, whom she had left three months ago on account of his cruelty to her. He remained all night, and, according to the stories told by the inmates of the house, he tried to persuade her and the child to return to New York with him. She refused. This morning shortly before nine he, without warning, drew a revolver and shot his wife and child, and then turned the weapon on himself. People in the house heard the shots and a police officer was secured. He broke open the door and found all three prostrate on the floor. The boy was dead and the man and woman dying.

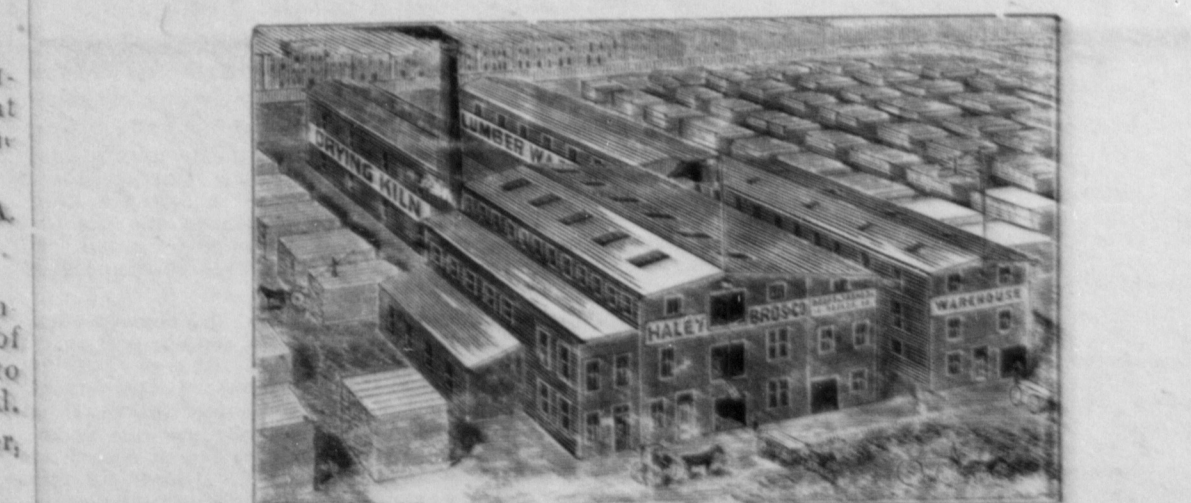
