A Visit to P. E. I.
Prince Edward Island, the garden of the Gulf of St. Lawrence, lies in the bosom of the great Acadian bay, which extends southward from an imaginary line drawn from Cape North, Cape Breton to Point Misou at the entrance of Baie de Chaleur. The "Silver Streak" of the Strait of Northumberland, separates it from the mainland. This silver streak is often dotted with ships, it is sometimes calm as a mirror, sometimes rough with curling billows, but the sun line beyond changes not for storm or calm. The island is as fondly termed by its law-abiding people, has no mountain, no stony hills, no barren wilderness, no stony land high unto making a man swear, no desolate heath. The island can boast that there is scarcely an acre of its surface but is capable of re-joying the husbandman's toil. It has a fine loamy soil, rich and deep with most of the necessary means of enriching it near at hand.

The face of the country is gently undulating, like a sea which has sobbed itself to rest and still has a remembrance of a far off storm, everywhere you can enjoy the bracing atmosphere of this lovely earthly paradise, where springs and streams of purest water abound. Not Old Erin itself is clad in richer green than this lovely island, when summer has bestowed upon it its crown of glory, with reddish soil cropping out here and there, throwing into sweeter relief the tender green of meadows and lawns, and at the right time of the year rich fields of golden waving grain, and its blue waters where swarms of the finny tribe abound.

From Point du Chene on the mainland to Summerside, is a most delightful sail. The magnificent steamship Northumberland, is a boat more fitted for an excursion boat, with all its trappings, draperies, and upholstery of the richest material, while the machinery is of the most improved style. It is commanded by Capt. Cameron who is supported by a fine staff of officers. We will not forget to make special mention of Miss Minnie Trainor, of Charlottetown, who is stewardess, and of whom we received much kindness. May she long be spared to enjoy a position which she fills so admirably.

From Summerside, one rides by rail through a fine section of country where the farmers have finished gathering their harvest. The writer made the acquaintance of Mr. Houle, manager of the road, who kindly gave him all the information required concerning this serpentine structure. At Charlottetown we took cab for Queen Hotel, whose proprietor is Mr. P. P. Archibald, formerly of the Albion Hotel, Halifax, N. S. Needless to say Mr. Archibald keeps a fine house.

Then we drove fifteen miles to Vernon River, where, absent for six years I saw many changes. Here we met friends from San Jose, Cal., whom we had not seen for twenty years. This section of the island looks prosperous with its fine farms, dwellings, barns and out-buildings.

In the village of Vernon River Bridge, is the residence of Hon. Geo. Forbes, together with a new roomy and well-stocked store, ware houses, lumber, lime, stone and coal yards to supply the farmers. He does an immense business every spring and fall shipping produce. He is to be a candidate in the coming election. A Liberal in politics, loyal to his friends as ever knight of old war to the principles he espoused, we wish him every success.

Port of Vernon House which nestles among the willows is cool and commodious, where the traveller is accommodated in city style. The hostess, Mrs. John Findlay is hospitable, and one can feel themselves perfectly at home. Mr. Daniel and Wm. McDonald who have a fine store and two comfortable dwellings, also do a large business. A Temperance Hall, Cheese Factory, with other buildings and dwellings too numerous to mention, have been erected since the writer's last visit.

The Cheese factory, although started about the 20th of June has turned out 1100 cheese, averaging 70 lbs per cheese. The average of milk was 12,000 lbs daily. At present it averages a little over 7000 lbs. We convey our thanks to Mr. Hoeber the manager, who explained to us cheese making, and the workings of the factory in general. The farmers say the factory is a great boon to them, little work with quick returns.

Now as I am about to return, bidding my friends a final farewell, with the old adage still ringing in my ears, Happy to meet, sorry to part, and happy to meet again with a warm welcome home, knowing where the treasures are, there shall the heart be glad.
