Census Statistics.

OTTAWA, Oct. 3.-The bulletin issued by the census bureau to-day conveys the information that the number of farmers in Canada decreased greatly between 1881 and 1891. The number of persons who farmers' sons, when the census was taken in 1891, was 735,207, a decrease of 7,206 in the whole Dominion, compared with figures of the 1881 census.

Leaving out farm laborers there were 656,712 farmers and farmers' sons in Canada in 1881, and 649,506 in 1891. In 1881 the number of farmers to each thousand of population in the Dominion was 155, compared with 140 when the last census was taken.

The bulletin also shows that 27,079 were engaged in fishing in 1891, 12,756 in lumbering, 15,168 in mining, 320,000 in industrial occupations, 63,280 in the profession and 186,695 in transportation and mercantile pursuits.
