In the High Court of Justice at Toronto on Tuesday Mrs. Annie Costello, widow of the late Dr. Costello, of Illinois, by her solicitor issued a writ for \$10,000 against Rev. Dr. Davies, also his wife and two sons, for conspiracy in having hindered and coerced Carleton Davies, his son, from

marrying the plaintiff. She also sues Carleton Davies for \$5,000 for breach of promise.

The girls have come into a fortune estimated at \$400,000, which fact probably more than the notoriety gained by the tragedy and trial explains the numerous offers of marriage which load her mail. Lizzie is said to be robust, but Emma has quite broken down.
