SEFT, 4,-On 30th ult., a special train came in on the B. & M. Railway, bringing Dr. and Mrs. DeBertiam, Receiver Evans, Messrs. Anderson and Bar of New York, Mr. and Mrs. John C. Harris, J. L. It is not known what their business is, but it is whispered to be for the purpose of interviewing the Government to try and get sufficient of the back subsidy to enable the new company to repair the Buctouche bridge. B. H. Foley, J. D. Irving and J. P. Leger were appointed a committee to get signatures to a petition praying the County Council to get a bill through the Legislature incorporating Buctouche as a fire district and authorizing them to issue \$4500 debentures maturing in twenty-five years. The petition requires a majority of the ratepayers and must represent over half the taxable property. There seems no doubt, but the town will soon have their engine.


Reports from the fishing vessels on the Grand Banks show that serious damage was done during the big gale, which raged furiously. Vessels are arriving daily more or less damaged. Many men were injured, but no losses of life are as yet reported.

She bowed again.




