The total loss is estimated at between forty-five and sixty thousand dollars and only about half this amount is covered by insurance.

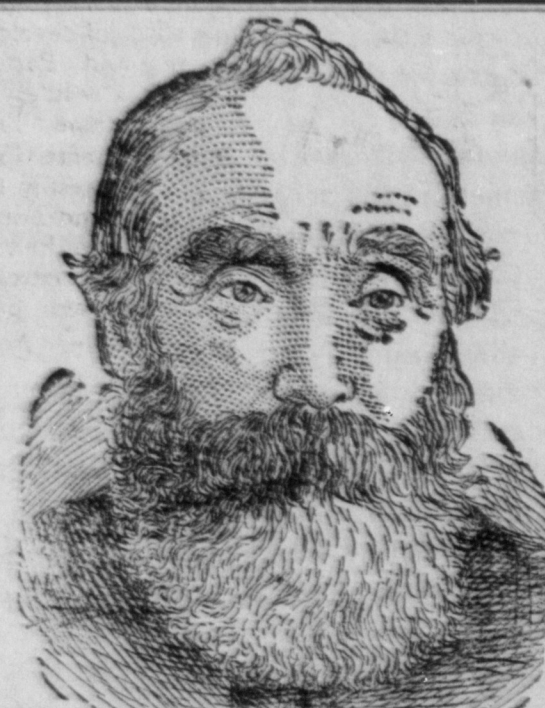

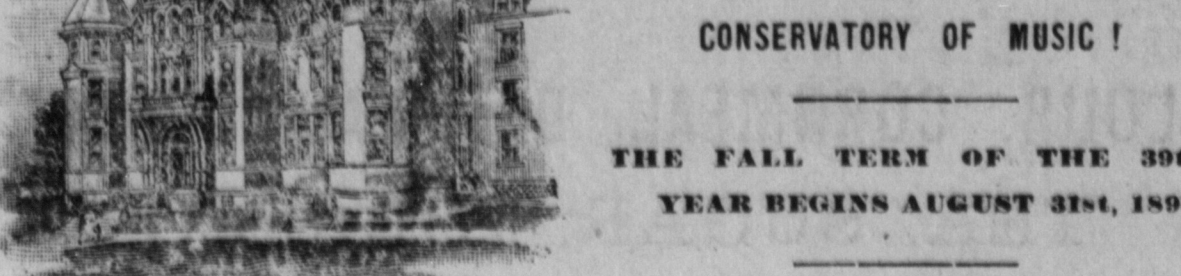
