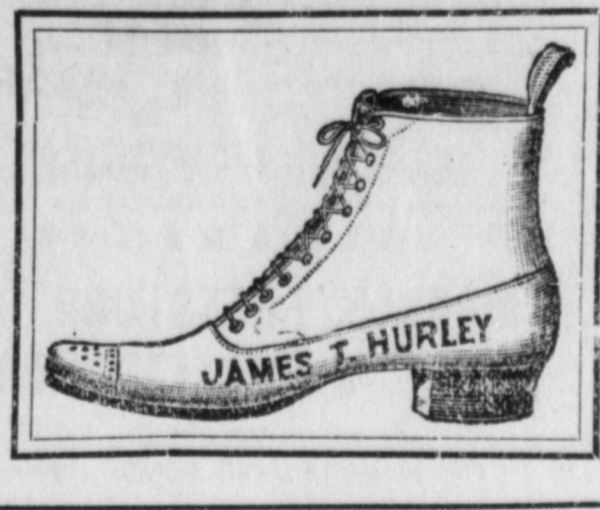
Thursday night about midnight a prisoner from Chatham in the jail at Newcastle, made a desperate and almost successful attempt to hang himself with his braces and handkerchief.
