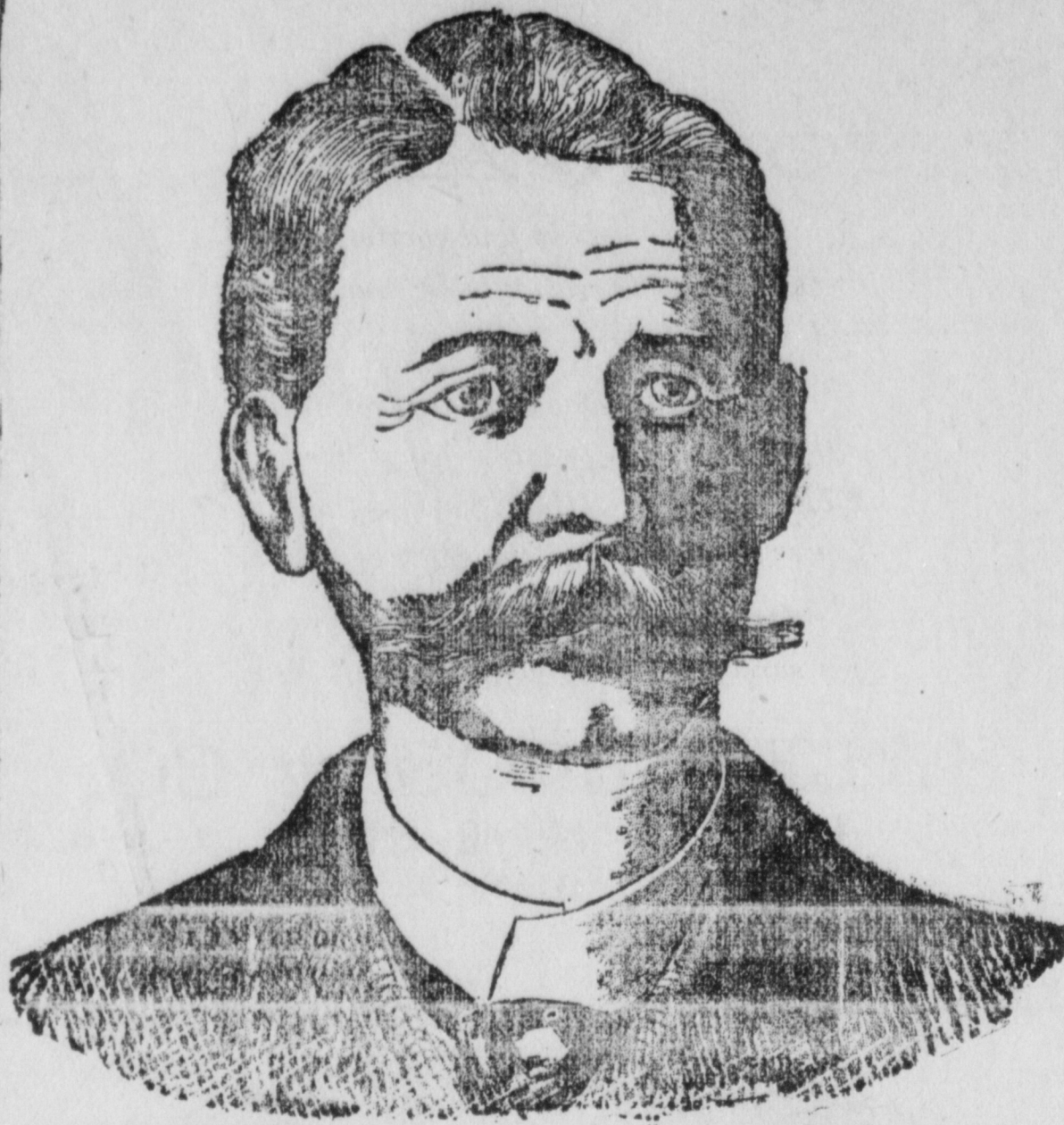


EX-MEMBER OF PARLIAMENT REUBEN E. TRUAX

Crabapple Preserves.

Pare the apples and put them into a porcelain kettle with not quite enough water to cover them. Boil for five minutes; then remove the apples and put into the water as much granulated sugar as you have fruit and boil it till clear; then set it aside until cold; skim well; return syrup and fruit to the kettle, sticking a clove or two into each apple. Let it all boil for about three minutes; then take the apples out very carefully so as to prevent their breaking, lay them into a jar, return the syrup to the fire and boil until rich and thick, when pour over the apples.

The Religions of China.

The eyes of the world are at the present time centered upon China. Particular interest is taken in the "Flowery Kingdom" by Christians. It is claimed that defeat in the present war would wonderfully open up the way for missionary work. China being now about the most unfruitful field for missions. Apropos of the progress of Christianity in the Empire, it might prove interesting to glance at the other great religions that hold sway there. Christianity counts for little so far, as not much has been accomplished, relatively. The state religion of China is Confucianism which, though, is rather a moral code than a religion. It is exclusively the belief of the higher class, and emanates from Confucius, who was born in 525 B. C.

Taoism is another religion of the country, and consists in the belief in a multitude of spirits, who are supposed to influence the destiny of man. Buddhism is the great popular religion of China, and has had a foothold there since the first century of our era. It alone has nearly a million of priests. A strange thing about it all is that there is a bond of harmony between these three faiths, the adherents of each of them frequently being found at worship in the same temple. For example, the Confucians, or high caste, will worship in the Buddhist, or lower-class temples, using the Taoist, or heathen ritual. This is more than can be said of a great many Christians, especially when we consider the great difference which exists between heathen religions.

A Brave Girl.

One of the last official acts of the late President Carnot, of France was the sending of a medal of the French Legion of Honor to a little American girl, named Jennie Carey, who lives at Munchford, Indiana.

Last year, while a train on the Pan Handle railroad, having on board several distinguished Frenchmen, was bound to Chicago and the World's Fair, Jennie Carey, who was then ten years old, discovered that a trestle was on fire, and that if the train, which was nearly due, ran upon it a dreadful wreck would take place.

Thereupon she ran out upon the track to a place where she could be seen for some little distance. Then she took off her red flannel skirt and, when the train came in view, waved it back and forth across the track.

It was seen and the train stopped. On board of it were seven hundred people, many of whom must have suffered death but for Jennie's courage and presence of mind.

When they returned to France, the Frenchmen on the train brought the occurrence to the notice of President Carnot, and the result was the sending of the medal of this famous French society, the purpose of which is the honoring of bravery and merit, wherever they may be found.

LONDON, Nov. 16.—A meeting of the British commission merchants who import Canadian cheese has been called for an early date to protest against alleged frauds said to be perpetrated on the trade by some of the largest Canadian shippers. These people, it is said, are sending out summer made cheese labeled as "September" made and thereby securing much higher prices for a much inferior article. Such actions on the part of Canadian shippers are, it is represented, sure to imperil Canada's cheese trade with the British Islands as well as other European countries.

A deputation is to wait on Sir Charles Tupper, Canada's High Commissioner, and request that the dominion government legislate forthwith, to ensure that each cheese, instead of each box, be branded with the date of making.
