#### GENERAL NEWS.

The woman's suffrage bill was refused passage in the Vermont House Thursday, 108 to 106.

President Moraes, of Brazil, has issued a decree granting amnesty to all political offenders.

Hereafter post office orders may be procured direct on Australia, instead of through England.

All is quiet in Honolulu. President Dale has just made a tour of the islands and was well received.

Fyfe and Thompson, the Strathroy, Ont., would-be train wreckers, get seventeen months in the Central prison.

The Bank of England has been released from the care of the Baring estate by friends and connections of the latter.

The Australian premiers met in Hobart on Nov. 29 to discuss imperial federation and intercolonial free trade.

There is a noticeable increase in the export of woolen goods from Great Britain to the United States since the passage of the Wilson bill.

Thirty partly decomposed human bodies have been found in a cave near Michoacan Mexico. They are supposed to belong to victims of bandits.

The Canadian cruiser Petrel reached Windsor, Ont., with 102 seized gillnets which belonged to Americans, but were set in Canadian waters.

It is stated that the three cases of small-pox at Strathroy, Ont., have been rigidly quarantined and that the danger of the disease spreading is over.

Eight lives were lost and property amounting to \$1,000,000 destroyed by the forest fires in the Bottoms of Tennessee. The fires are still raging.

The ships engaged in Arctic sea fishing have all reached Dundee, and report the value of the season's catch at £38,750, over a third less than last year.

Monsignor Lorenzelli, Papal Nuncio to the Netherlands, is spoken of in Rome as the next Apostolic Delegate to the United States, to succeed Monsignor Satolli.

The General Assembly of the Knights of Labor at New Orleans has decided that lawyers may not belong to the Order. Working bartenders are also excluded from it.

Capt. Romine, a French officer convicted of spying upon the Italian army and forts was sentenced at San Remo on Thursday to fourteen months' imprisonment and fined 1,200 francs.

Early Friday morning fire broke out in the barns of the Alleghany traction company. Forty-nine head of horses and seven electric cars were burned. The entire loss is about \$75,000.

Mrs. Maybrick, the American woman under life sentence for killing her husband, has petitioned the Queen, pleading her innocence and asking her to order a public examination of the evidence.

While performing in the Boston Y. M. C. A. Gymnasium Wednesday night, Frank E. Godfrey, one of the superintendents, fell and broke his neck in attempting a somersault from the shoulders of a companion.

A solemn service was held at Notre Dame church, Montreal, Thursday, for the repose of the souls of persons buried in the Cote Des Neiges cemetery. From 1642 to the present time 263,865 persons have been interred in the Roman Catholic cemetery.

Henry C. Kerber and James E. Fitzgerald, New York custom house inspectors, were suspended on Thursday. They are charged with having passed dutiable goods in the trunks of Dean Hole, the eminent Englishman, who arrived last month and is now lecturing in this country.

Carnegie's wire nail works at Beaver Falls, Penn., occupying a whole square, was burned on Friday night. Total loss \$100,000. The works were equipped with the finest machinery, which was destroyed. Two hundred men will be thrown out of employment.

One hundred men employed by the Miller Piano Co. at Wakefield, Mass., who struck for a ten per cent. increase in salary a week ago, returned to work on Friday at the old scale of prices. The officers of the company agreed to pay the men the same rate of wages paid in other piano manufactories.

The property of the Caribou Gold Mining Co. has been transferred to Messrs. Wm. H. Brookfield and Walter G. Brookfield, Halifax, and Herbert Sturdee, of St. John, for \$40,000. There is a condition in the transfer that calls for the return of the property to the seller providing they pay back the \$40,000 within nine months.


