The anti-foreign feeling in Pekin is growing steadily. Foreigners while on the streets of the city are subjected continually to annoyance and insult by soldiers. They seem scarcely to realize the fact that the country is engaged in a serious war.

MONTREAL, Sept. 26.—The American Public Health Association convention, which opened here yesterday continued this morning, when Dr. Warden, of Bridgeport, Conn., in a paper introduced the subject of tuberculosis. He advocated the placing of that disease on the contagious list and the compulsory disinfection of all places where patients from tuberculosis have passed. No tuberculosis female should ever nurse a child; no consumptive should ever spit on a floor and the spit should be immediately burned; no consumptive should ever sleep with another person, and in general hospitals such persons should be isolated.

NEW YORK, Sept. 28.—A despatch from Montevideo says: Admiral da Gama asserts there has been rioting in Rio de Janeiro, lasting five days, accompanied by outrages on Portuguese merchants. It was instigated directly by President Peixoto, who incited the soldiers dressed as citizens. Rio, it is reported, looks like a great military camp, with soldiers patrolling the streets, cavalry encamped in the public gardens, and launches patrolling the harbor front. The number of killed is stated to be 328 and 213 wounded. The damage to property of Portuguese, British and other foreign residents will amount to \$1,500,000. The British minister has asked for a guard at the Legation and residence. This was granted him. The British Legation is crowded with refugees, who, although promised protection by the authorities, are afraid to go on the streets. Italian and Portuguese houses have been fired.

A SCOTCH LASSIE RESCUED BY A CANADIAN.

Wholesale Pardoning.

WASHINGTON, D. C., Sept. 28.—The president has issued a proclamation granting full amnesty and pardon to all persons who have committed either of the offenses of polygamy, bigamy, or unlawful cohabitation under the color of polygamous or plural marriage, or who, having been convicted of violations of said acts and now suffering deprivation of civil rights in consequence of the same, excepting all persons who have not complied with the conditions contained in executive proclamation of January 4, 1893, which granted amnesty to the Mormons upon their future obedience to the statutes forbidding polygamous marriages.
