C., Sept. 28.—The president has issued a proclamation granting full amnesty and pardon to all persons who have committed either of the offences polygamy, bigamy, or unlawful cohabitation under the color of polygamous of plural marriage, or who, having been convicted of violations of said acts and now suffering deprivation of civil rights in consequence of the same, excepting all persons who have not complied with the onditions contained in executive proclamation of January 4, 1893, which grant-ed amnesty to the Mormons upon their future obedience to the statutes forbidding polygamous marriages
