will sink to the bottom and lie on its side as quietly as a stone. The air chamber at the big end of the egg soon begins to develop and if, after a few days, it be again immersed, it will bob about on the slightest agitation of the water, and act as though it were trying to stand on the little end. ### The Oriana Wins.

CHATHAM, Sept. 14.—The Miramichi Yacht Club's most successful race of this season was sailed off Newcastle yesterday afternoon, in a strong and puffy north-west breeze that grew light towards the finish. The course was from off Cail's wharf to the Canadian Marsh buoy, thence to a mark boat off Strawberry Marsh, thence across the starting line, twice around, a distance of twelve miles. The start was made in the following order: Maude, J. C. Miller, 2.31.05; Kilbride, Chas. Sergeant, 2.30.18; Oriana, J. L. Stewart, 2.32.45; Learig, Alex. Burr, 2.34.05. The leaders struck a calm streak near the first buoy, and the hind boats caught up and turned with them, the four going around together, Oriana having the pole. Maude got a heavy squall after rounding and rushed quickly to the front holding first place till Oriana passed her in a light breeze on the homestretch. Learig got second place and held it, closely followed by Oriana. She fouled Maude turning Canadian Marsh buoy the second time, when Oriana slipped by and kept ahead of her to the finish. Kilbride kept well up till the last buoy was turned, but was left a long way behind in the dying wind on the home stretch. The feature of the race was the splendid heavy weather qualities shown by the commodore's boat, Maude, with her new racing mainsail and big jib. The time was taken by E. Lee Street, and the yachts were followed over the course by the steamer Laura. Oriana won by 1 min. 57 sec., with Maude second and Learig third on corrected time. This is Oriana's second victory this year out of three races sailed, she having won the race to Bay du Vin on corrected time.
