It Was Costly Love.

NEW YORK, Sept. 20.—Miss Matilda Darlington, who is about 23 years old, has brought suit in the Superior Court to recover \$25,000 claimed to be due on a note from William G. Wood, a retired real estate dealer with a family, who lives at 259 Lenox Avenue. Mr. Wood set up as a defence counter claims for \$33,681.13, and also declared that there was no consideration for the note. Miss Darlington pleaded in reply that the articles and money mentioned in his counter claims were given for the considerations of "love and affection" and that the note had the same consideration. The defendants rejoined:

"There was no consideration for the said note, but if there were any such things as 'love and affection,' it had been liquidated a hundred times over."

The note was made Oct. 23, 1893 and was made payable at the residence of the defendant, 259 Lenox Avenue, on demand. The plaintiff says that she caused demand to be made on Jan. 16 last, and that the defendant allowed the note to go to protest at an expense to her of \$1.43, which she wants along with the \$25,000. Her lawyers, required a bill of particulars of the counter claims, and received four pages of type-written matter. It enumerates jewelry purchased for plaintiff, furniture delivered, and work done upon her house.

Memramcook Gold Mining Co.

The adjourned annual meeting of the Memramcook Gold Mining Co. was held at Dorchester yesterday. About 265,000 shares were represented. J. B. Neilly was among the share holders present. Some changes were made in the bye-laws. The section relating to directors was altered making the number of directors five instead of nine. The section relating to the number of shareholders required at a meeting to constitute a quorum was also changed. In future a meeting will be competent to transact business on 20 per cent. of the stock being represented and ten shareholders being present.

The directors elected for the ensuing year were Messrs. E. C. Cole, Moncton; Dr. Gaudet, Memramcook; C. E. Freeman, Anahurst; A. C. Vanmeter and J. W. Y. Smith. The two latter represent the Halifax shareholders.

A resolution was passed authorizing the directors to raise funds by mortgage or otherwise to pay off the present indebtedness and make another test of the mine.

At a meeting of the directors held at the close of the shareholders meeting J. W. Y. Smith was chosen president and E. C. Cole vice president.—Times.

WINDSOR, Ont., Sept. 20.—The Rev. J. C. Wheat in Russia.

United States Consul-General Jones at St. Petersburg, in a report, points to the fact that the early completion of the Siberian railroad is likely to have depressing effect upon the prices of grain throughout the world. No reliable estimate can be formed of the probable export of Siberian grain to Europe by this road, and one rough estimate, placing it at 6,000,000 bushels for the west Siberian section, is regarded as decidedly too low. Moreover, the completion of the road is expected to greatly stimulate the planting of grain in the black soil belt, famous for its fertility. In 1889 the Siberian Government produced a surplus of 30,000,000 bushels of grain. To lessen the depressing effect upon the local St. Petersburg market of the expected influx of Siberian wheat a new outlet is being provided by a line of railroad from Perm, already connected with western Siberia, to Kotlas, on the Dvina river, offering an easy waterway to Archangel, on the White sea, whence the wheat can be exported to other European countries.
