## To Enfranchise Women,

MONTPELIER, Vt , Oct. 31.-A bill was introduced in the House this morning entitled "an act to enable women to become voters under certain conditions" providing for an intelligent ballot for all persons. It provides that all women, residents of the state over 21, may vote at all town meetings, provided they take the freeman's oath and pay a poll tax the same as men. They shall be eligible to hold all offices in the gift of the people and be subject to all the duties of men except bearing arms. They cannot take the freeman's oath unless they are willing to swear they do not favor anarchy, nihilism or socialism. The act does not become a law unless a majority of the women in the state so elect.




