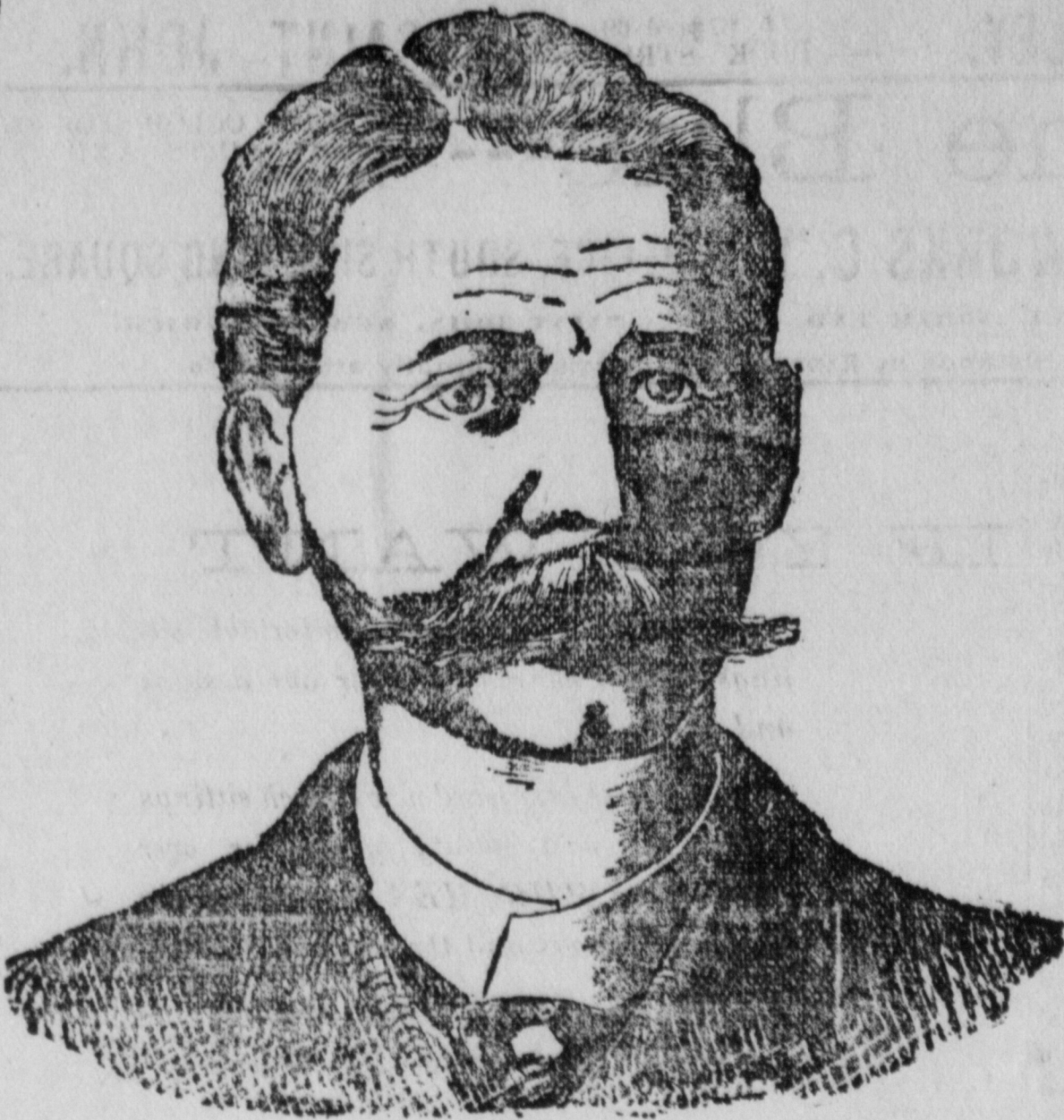


## EX-MEMBER OF PARLIAMENT REUBEN E. TRUAX

PARIS, Aug. 30.—A despatch from St. Louis, capital of the French possessions in Senegambia says the Touaregs recently surprised the French and after three days fighting pursued them to Timbuctoo, where another fight took place, resulting, as before, in favor of the Touaregs. The French sortied from Timbuctoo but were overwhelmed with numbers and forced to retire. In the latter fight three companies of the French soldiers were cut to pieces.

SHANGHAI.—It is reported here that the Japanese transports, escorted by war vessels, are landing troops in force to the northward of Taku, with the intention of marching upon Peking.

Another report says that the Japanese have succeeded in landing 20,000 men on the banks of the Gahu river separating Korea from China, and that they have thus cut off the supplies of the large army which the Chinese have sent down the Korean Peninsula.

Finally, this report says that the Japanese troops are converging upon the rear of the Chinese army marching southward and that the latter will, consequently, be taken between two fires, in addition to being cut off from its supplies, which, it is claimed, will alone bring about disaster.
