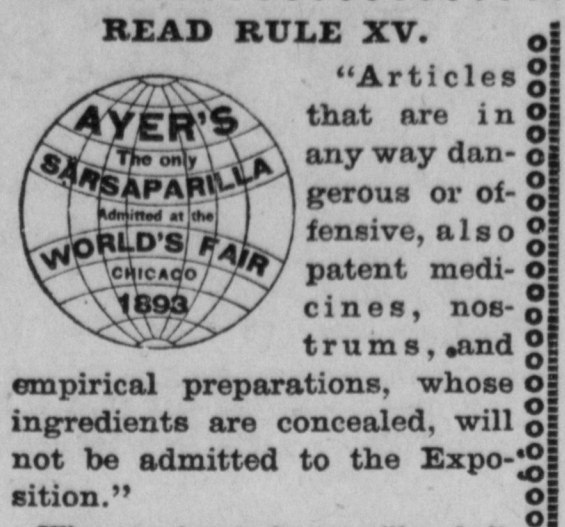


NUGGETS.
