

OTTAWA, December 9.—Solicitor General Burran expresses the opinion that the ramor that Sir John Thompson is about to retire to the Judicial committee of the Privy council is most improbable. He quotes the act 34, William fourth, chapter forty-one, constituting a Judicial committee to show that a stipend of only £400 per annum each was provided for two members In 1876 the act was amended so that the whole stipend of £800 could be paid to one person. The solicitor General is of opinion that if there was a vacancy, before any colonial gentleman could be appointed a stipend sufficient to reimburse him in any degree for his services, there would have to be new legislation in the British parliament, and this of itself precludes the possibility of any appointment such as is suggested for a long time to come. 




