

A young man named Tom Stevens met with a very painful accident in Humphrey's woolen mills near Moncton last week. He was passing a large vat when in some manner he lost his footing and fell into the boiling water. His legs and hips were frightfully scalded. It is not thought that his injuries will prove fatal. A correspondent of the Moncton Times at Fox Creek, parish of Moncton, writes that the horn fly has been getting very thick since last week in Fox Creok and Memramcook. This new cattle pest made its first appearance in Canada in the summer of 1892. The flies are very bad. NOVA SCOTIA.

The infant son of Wilbur Colburn, of Oxford Junction, fell into a well one day last week. The doctor thinks the child was killed by striking its head on the stone wall rather than by being drowned. A young man named Archibald Osmer, fireman on board the S. S. Louisburg, was drowned at the Intercolonial pier, Sydney C. B., last Monday Evening. A number of seamen were bathing near the pier and it is thought Osmer took cramps and was unable to reach the wharf. Capt. Cook, of the barge Grandee, arrived and dove after Osmer. He brought him from the bottom, but too late to save the poor fellow's life. He belonged to Trinity, Nfld., and was about 25 years of age.

MANITOBA.

The town of Morden, Man., has a supposed murder case. When Farmer Vanalstine and his wife, who live near Morden started for church on Sunday evening, they left two farm laborers, Ed. Cannuff and Sam Lard, in charge. On their retnrn Lard was missing. The other said he had gone out to pick berries and refused to return. Little was thought of it at the time, but on Monday, after Vanalstine and Cannuff had gone to the marsh, sixteen miles away, to cut hay, Mrs. Vanalstine discovered a bullet hole in the window glass and blood stains on the floor. Neighbors were called in and decided to send for a constable, who after taking in the situation, made a search and soon discovered a newly-made grave. He at once proceeded to the marsh and took Cannuff into custody, who then confessed that he had accidentally shot his companion and through fear had buried the body.
