A NATIVE OF KINGSTON, KENT.—Mr. Robertson, the new mayor of St. John, was born on the 30th of January, 1844, at Kingston, Kent Co., and is consequently 50 years old. His father the late Duncan Robertson, ship-builder, was a native of Aberdeen, Scotland. Mr. Robertson was educated at Sackville and spent the greater part of his boyhood days at Moncton and Coalgue. In 1860 he went to St. John in search of employment and secured an engagement with Mr. James McFarlane, then a leading grocer and remained with him as clerk for seven years. In 1868 Mr. Robertson started business on his own account and to-day he is head of the firm which bears his name and which is one of the largest and most successful wholesale and retail grocery establishments.

OUR CANADIAN HOME.—This evening Mr. McInerney, M. P., will discuss "Canadian Retrospect and Forecast" in the Academic Hall of Ottawa University.

The eloquent member for Kent, N. B., has been in Parliament only two years, yet he is already classed as one of Canada's most accomplished orators. The lecture was one of the best ever heard in Ottawa and elicited the most favorable comment. After expatiating on Canada's past he dealt with the future, tabling forward to the time when the Mother England and the colonies would form a grand federation of nations. The musical part of the programme was good, comprising selections by well known amateurs. FREDERICTON, April 21.—This morning Hon. Mr. Emmerson submitted the returns re Suspension Bridge repairs, asked for by Smith (St. John).

At 10 o'clock His Honor Lieutenant Governor Fraser came to the Assembly and assented to the bills passed during the session with the exception of the bill respecting the use of tobacco by minors, as to which his honor reserved his assent.

The House prorogued at 10.30 this morning.
