For a swollen toe joint soak in warm water in which a handful of salt is dissolved. Dissolve as much salt in a quart bottle of het water as the water will take up, and use this as a lotion. Wet several thicknesses of linen to use as a pad, pour on it four drops of armica extract, apply the arnicated side to the joint, and cover with a bandage. Easy fitting boots or shoes are essential.

Why Ovsters are Brain Food.

Urging the use of oysters as food, an exchange says: "Speaking roughly, a quart of oysters contains, on the average, about the same quantity of actual nutritive substance as a quart of milk, or a pound of very lean beet, or a pound and a half of fresh cod-fish, or two-thirds of a pound of bread. But while the weight of actual nutriment in the different quantities of food material is very nearly the same, the quality is widely different. That of the very lean meat or codfish, consists mostly of what are called in chemical anguage protein compounds, or "flesh formers "-the substances which make blood muscle, tendon, bone, brain and other nitrogenous tissues.
