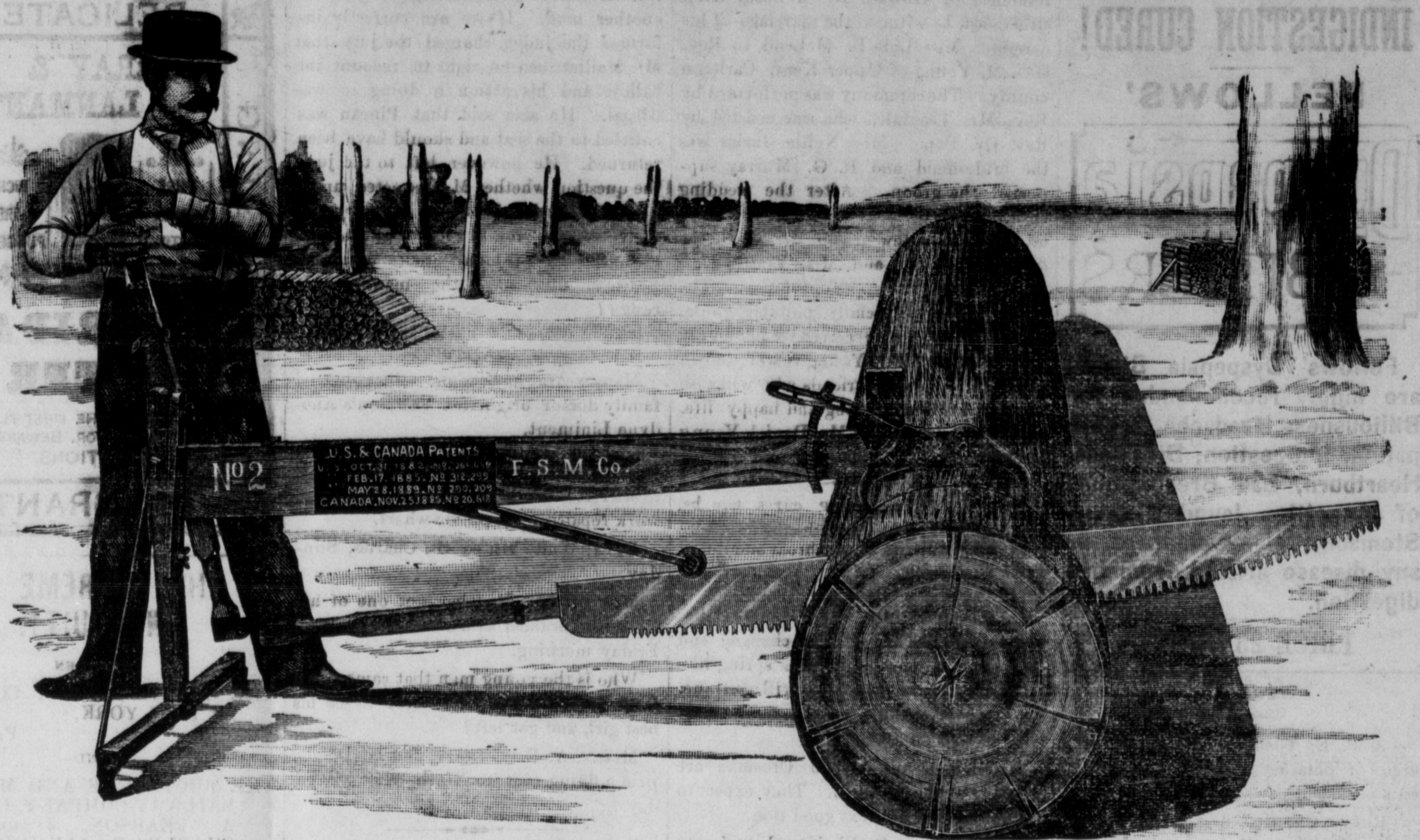

The Castinado.
