#### TWAS ALL A MISTAKE.

The Trouble Between the French and English.

London, Jan. 5 .- Military and political circles are excited to-day by a sensational report which reached here from Sierra Leone, Senagambia, the British colonial settlement of West Africa. According to the report received here Captain E. A. W. Londy, inspector general of the frontier police, and twenty-six men and several officers of the 1st battalion of an East In dian regiment, who were engaged in an expedition against the Sofias, have been killed, and it is added that they were shot by French troops. It is also asserted that a French officer engaged in the attack was captured and that this confirms the story that the British force was destroyed by French troops.

The affair has caused the greatest excitement. No further details have as yet been received. The expedition started a few weeks ago to chastise the Sofias, who have been giving much trouble to British traders on the coast near the French territory. The sensation mongers are already looking upon this colonial incident as being likely to be the spark which will cause a war between England and France, but the fact remains that the report is unconfirmed and that it will take a great deal more than a frontier incident to cause asked me for ten cents to help you to a England to disturb the peace of Europe. The officers killed were Capt. Londy, Lieutenant C. Wronghton, and Lieut. Liston and a sergeant.

According to all accounts the French opened fire upon the British troops without provocation or warning.

The attack took place at a district whose possession is still a matter of dispute between France and England.

The French troops consisted chiefly of Senagal negroes, officered by Frenchmen. LATER DETAILS.

LONDON, Jan. 6. - Further details from Freetown, capital of Sierre Leone, of the killing of the British troops show the British were encamped in Conoh district, near Warina. The camp was within the British sphere. At daylight, December 23 they were attacked by the French, consisting of thirty i enegale.e sharpshooters and 1,200 natives, headed by Lieut. Moritz. When they were fired upon the British responded and the French shortly afterwards retired. Lieut. Moriiz was wounded and captured by the British. He explained that he believed the British troops who were blacks, were members of the So fia cribes, and that their European officers, who were deeply tanned, were Arabs. Only six British privates were killed, instead of twenty-six. Four fficers were slain. The French loss is no known.

A MISTAKE.

LONDON, Jan. 7 .- Cal. Ellis, of th East India Regiment, telegraphs that the French-British battle at Marina was due to an error on the part of Lieut. Mori z commander of the French troops, who mistook the British for hostile So fias Lieut Moritz was wounded and has since died.


