Horsepower of a Whale.

An interesting study of the horsepower of the whale has been made by the eminent anatomist, Sir William Turnes of the University of Edinburgh, in conjunction with Mr. John Henderson, the equally eminent Glasgow shipbuilder. The size and dimensions of a great whale stranded several years ago on the shore at Longrid- dy furnished the necessary data for a com- putation of the power necessary to propel it at the rate of 12 miles an hour. This whale measured 80 feet in length, 20 across the flanges of the tail and weighed 74 tons. It was calculated that 145 horsepower was necessary to attain the speed mentioned.—London Exchange.

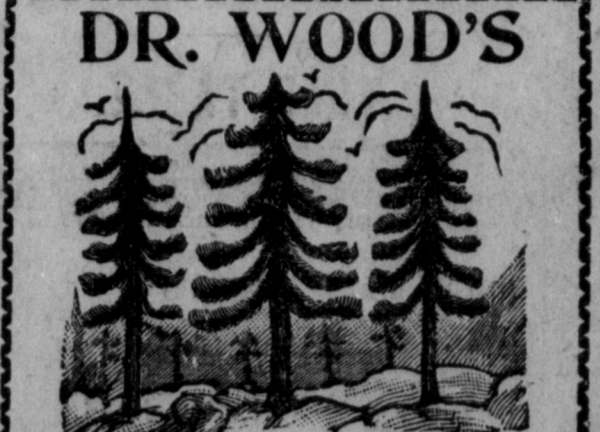
